- Assemblies are held each fortnight at 2:30pm on a Friday, a teacher will contact you on Wednesday or before, if your child is receiving a Principal's award.


- We ask that all students arrive at school by 8.40 so that they have time to set up their desk, put their diary out, and be ready for learning at 8:45.

LITERACY

In Term 2, we will continue to embed our new Literacy structure. Our early literature focus will be a text by Shaun Tan, titled 'The Arrival'. The Arrival is a migrant story told as a series of wordless images. This will work in sync with our Inquiry topic. We will explore poetry and information texts in the later part of the term.



SMART SPELLING

Our spelling practices have been a big focus for us this term as all classes implemented the SMART program. Our students are loving the consistency of the program and development of their spelling skills is evident through SeeSaw. We encourage all parents to celebrate their child's achievements and practice their spelling words which are recorded on SeeSaw weekly. SMART Spelling is an explicit and systematics approach to teaching spelling, which will be implemented from Foundation to Year 6. Students will focus on a list of words each week, with 80% of the words belonging to a particular sound-letter relationship. 20% of the words will come from the students' own writing and they are

called 'BOB' words. Within the Literacy program, we explicitly teach spelling patterns and rules aligned to a scope and sequence. Weekly word lists will be shared with families on See Saw for opportunities to practice them at home (optional).



INQUIRY

HISTORY

Inquiry this term will be integrated across the curriculum and tied into our whole school celebration of its 150th anniversary. Students will learn about our local history and share its story in an interactive project shared with our school community. We will explore:

- The history of Geelong & Ceres
- The history of Ceres Primary School/milestones
- Explore the future what changes we predict will happen around us
- Further develop students ICT, research and Literacy skills



READING JOURNAL

Thank you to all families who have purchased a Resilience Journal Reading Log. We have continued to track reading nights across the school and celebrate milestones through tokens and certificates for students achieving 25, 50, 75 etc recorded nights. The journals offer wellbeing resources which align to our school practices and help create a shared understanding of positive wellbeing strategies between home and school and in turn will help enhance happiness and resilience in and out of the classroom.





Did you know that just 10 minutes of reading a day will change your child's life? While that may seem like a big statement to make, numerous studies have consistently shown that 10 minutes exposure to reading materials each day is all it takes to positively shape your child's future. And this doesn't just include complicated educational texts—any reading materials, be it comic books, novels, picture books, recipes, the television guide or the back of food packets, all count towards your child's daily reading goal. Reading any of these materials for 10 minutes a day exposes your child to more than 600,000 words in one year interestingly, that's more than double the word exposure of a child who only reads for 5 minutes or less each day. The benefit of this word exposure is immense—research shows us that reading more improves a child's performance in general knowledge, vocabulary, reading comprehension, verbal fluency and spelling. But this goal of reading for 10 minutes each day isn't only to improve your child's academic success; the effects of this achievement are far more long-term than you may have anticipated.

NUMERACY

We had great success with splitting the Year 4 students with the 5/6 's in Term and will continue to do so for Term 2. Our topics will include:


- Chance outcomes and statistics
- Operations
- Area/perimeter
- Symmetry/translations

All students have access to Mathletics and Essential Assessment that can be used a home to further reinforce the concepts we cover at school. We encourage all students to access these at home were possible.

VALUES

We consistently use our Positive Behaviour Matrix to discuss important values. Each week, we focus on a specific point in our matrix. In the last week, we have been focussing on trying our best, as part of practising resilience.

We also use our resilience project journals to reflect on our wellbeing, which we will continue using lots in Term 2!
