Reflection: Ascension Sunday

Before departing this world, Jesus gives the apostles a solemn commission: "Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation" (Mark 16:15). What did Jesus mean by "all creation"? Probably "all nations," as in Matthew's gospel (28:19). But it's possible that he really meant the whole of creation, and that's worth reflecting on.

When the world was called into being, the book of Genesis tells us, God saw that "it was very good" (1:31). All creation remains good in God's eyes, but the tiny part of it we call home, Planet Earth, isn't well. The progress that human beings have enjoyed in the past century has been costly for the earth. In his encyclical Laudato si' (On Care for Our Common Home), Pope Francis wrote about the "sickness evident in the soil, in the water, in the air and in all forms of life" (#2). He appealed to us to become good news, not bad news, for our sick world.

How can we be good news for creation? First and foremost, by seeing it as the work of God's love. "Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God" (#84). That's a beautiful phrase, "a caress of God." It's not just a romantic sentiment but a truth to be appreciated. Francis went on, "... all of us are linked by unseen bonds and together form a kind of universal family, a sublime communion which fills us with a sacred, affectionate and humble respect" (#89).

Only sacred respect for the communion of all things can inspire the ecological conversion that Francis calls for. If we care for our common home with "a spirit of generous care, full of tenderness" (#220), we will fulfil Jesus' command and be good news for all creation.

Domenica dell'Ascensione, 16 maggio 2021

Prima di lasciare questo mondo, Gesù dà agli apostoli un incarico solenne: "Andate in tutto il mondo; proclamate la Buona Novella a tutta la creazione" (Marco 16:15). Cosa intendeva Gesù con "tutta la creazione"? Probabilmente "tutte le nazioni", come nel vangelo di Matteo (28:19). Ma è possibile che intendesse davvero l'intera creazione, e su questo vale la pena riflettere.

Quando il mondo fu chiamato in essere, ci dice il libro della Genesi, Dio vide che "era molto buono" (1:31). Tutta la creazione rimane buona agli occhi di Dio, ma la piccola parte di essa che chiamiamo casa, il pianeta Terra, non va bene. Il progresso di cui hanno goduto gli esseri umani nel secolo scorso è stato costoso per la terra. Nella sua enciclica Laudato si' (sulla cura della nostra casa comune), Papa Francesco ha scritto della "malattia evidente nel suolo, nell'acqua, nell'aria e in tutte le forme di vita" (n. 2). Ci ha invitato a diventare una buona notizia, non una cattiva notizia, per il nostro mondo malato.

Come possiamo essere una buona notizia per la creazione? In primo luogo, vedendolo come l'opera dell'amore di Dio. "Terra, acqua, montagne: tutto è come una carezza di Dio" (n. 84). Questa è una bellissima frase, "una carezza di Dio". Non è solo un sentimento romantico, ma una verità da apprezzare. Francesco continua, ". . . tutti noi siamo legati da legami invisibili e insieme formiamo una sorta di famiglia universale, una comunione sublime che ci riempie di un rispetto sacro, affettuoso e umile" (n. 89).

Solo il sacro rispetto per la comunione di tutte le cose può ispirare la conversione ecologica che Francesco chiede. Se ci prendiamo cura della nostra casa comune con "uno spirito di cura generosa, piena di tenerezza" (n. 220), adempiremo al comando di Gesù e saremo una buona notizia per tutta la creazione.

First Reading Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

The word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Gospel Mark 16:15-20

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised is saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.
