WELCOME

Welcome to the 2023 School year! It has been a wonderful start to the year with children settling in well to the new routines of school.

Please find below an outline of the curriculum areas that will be covered throughout the term.

ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

- Using the pictures for clues
- Identifying the initial sounds in words
- Establishing positive reading routines and expectations
- Beginning to recognise some high frequency words
- Engaging in rhymes, chants and songs and listening for repeated sounds and rhyming words

Writing

- Building simple handwriting movements
- Writing letters which resemble letter formations
- Beginning to understand the difference between lower and upper case letters
- Writing their name correctly
- Drawing pictures to convey meaning
- Sharing ideas with actions and speech

- Presenting experiences and sharing interests with the class

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION
