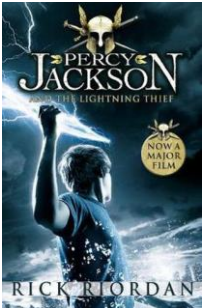


# RECOMMENDED READS

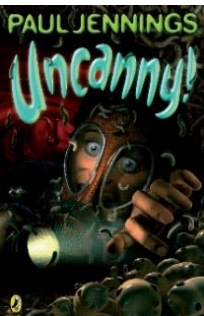

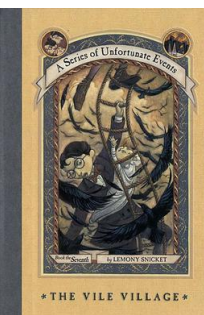
