Undergraduate Studentships at CSIRO

Our undergraduate studentships offer students exciting opportunities for you to gain experience in a scientific environment.

CSIRO offers <u>Undergraduate Vacation Studentships</u> which run over the Australian summer holidays and offers high achieving and promising university students the opportunity to collaborate with leading CSIRO researchers in their world class facilities.

These prestigious studentships are highly sought after. Every year over 100 opportunities are offered to eligible undergraduate students in a number of disciplines.

Students have the chance to work on a real project in science, technology or a related field such as science communication. Placements are full time and typically begin in late November or early December and can be from 8 - 12 weeks in length.

Successful applicants are able to expand their skills and knowledge and there are often opportunities for formal and informal training and development during their time with CSIRO. Students are usually required to write a report on their work experience and will have the opportunity to present their vacation project to their peers at the end of the studentship.

Vacation students will be paid a stipend and, in some cases, may also receive a contribution towards their travel and accommodation costs.

To be considered for a Vacation Studentship, students:

- Will need to be enrolled at an Australian University;
- Will have completed not less than three years of a full-time (or equivalent) undergraduate degree at commencement of the studentship, however exceptional second year students may be considered;
- Will have a strong academic record (credit average or higher);
- Intend to pursue a research career in science or technology, or a career in a related discipline; and
- Will need to be available to undertake a full-time placement for 8-12 weeks over the university summer vacation period.

Senior students considering a career in the sciences or technology might like to keep this program in mind. The CSIRO also offers Undergraduate Traineeships that might be of interest too.



Richmond Institute of Sports Leadership

Students interested in a career in sport are invited to join us live at the Richmond Football Club to learn more about the Richmond Institute of Sports Leadership which is delivered in partnership with Swinburne University of Technology.

The <u>Diploma of Sport/Diploma of Leadership and Management</u> is delivered through Richmond Football Club's partnership with Swinburne University of Technology. This unique program is aimed at developing the next generation of leaders within the sports industry.

This dual diploma combines theory, practical and hands-on learning with a focus on real world skills and knowledge. Students will learn how to enhance athlete performance, manage people and teams, and become a leader.

As a part of the course, students are encouraged to complete 100 hours of industry work placement, and this work placement must be relevant to the content of the course. In partnership with Swinburne and the Richmond Football Club you will:

- Acquire skills and knowledge from industry experts, including insight from one of the most successful sporting clubs in Australia.
- Complete nationally recognised qualifications with a world-class university.
- Experience unrivalled professional development, industry placement and employment opportunities.
- Focus on personal development, including improving yourself and your connection with others.

Snapshot of The University of Melbourne (UoM) in 2023

- Established in 1853, the University of Melbourne makes distinctive contributions to society in research, learning and teaching and engagement.
- UoM is consistently ranked among the leading universities in the world, with international rankings of world universities placing it as #1 in Australia and #34 in the world (Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2022), and #1 in the world in numerous subjects (QS World Rankings by subject 2022) - rankings.
- The University of Melbourne has one primary campus Parkville north of the Melbourne CBD and associated campuses including Southbank, and rural campuses - <u>Campuses and</u> Facilities.
- UoM offers 17 undergraduate degrees and over 250 graduate courses <u>Courses at UoM.</u>
 <u>Currently 50% of students study undergraduate courses, and the other 50% are in graduate programs.</u>

- <u>UoM offers a small range of Graduate Degree Packages whereby students can</u> bundle an
 undergraduate degree offer with an offer for a place in one of the specialised, professionally
 accredited graduate school programs.
- <u>The Bachelor of Design offers 13 majors, including Architecture, Civil Engineering Systems, Computing and Software Systems, Construction, Digital Infrastructure Engineering Systems, Graphic Design, Landscape Architecture, Mechanical Engineering Systems, Performance Design, Property, Spatial Systems, Urban Planning, and User Experience Design.</u>
- The University has over 200 clubs and societies, which play an integral part of many students' university experience <u>Student Clubs and Societies</u>.
- The University encourages students to make practical learning a part of their Melbourne experience, and these include internships and cadetships, leadership opportunities, and volunteering.
- Overseas study programs are offered to students, and they are encouraged to study part of their degree in an international setting - <u>Study Overseas</u>.
- The University of Melbourne offers numerous and generous undergraduate <u>scholarships</u> to high-achieving students, as well as numerous equity scholarships too. Recently introduced scholarships are the <u>Melbourne Principals' Scholarship</u> and <u>Hansen Scholarship</u>.

A New Pathway to Medicine at UniSQ

If you're looking to become a Doctor, you know you'll need to study one of the few (and competitive) degrees out there that lead to your chosen career. UniSQ are now making it easier for regional students to realise their dreams, launching the Bachelor of Biomedical Sciences (Medicine Pathway).

Upon successful completion of the degree within three years and with a minimum Grade Point Average of 5.0, students will gain direct entry into the University of Queensland's (UQ) MD, delivered by the UQ Rural Clinical School, Toowoomba.

The <u>Bachelor of Biomedical Sciences (Medicine Pathway)</u> is part of the Darling Downs South West Medical Pathway, a collaboration between University of Southern Queensland, The University of Queensland, Darling Downs Health and South West Hospital and Health Service. The goal of the collaboration is to provide end to end medical training in the Darling Downs and South West regions to enhance our rural, regional and remote medical workforce.

Regional and rural students are encouraged to apply and may be eligible for ATAR adjustments if they reside in a rural area in southern Queensland and northern New South Wales, however all students are eligible to apply for this course.



Spotlight on Studying Medicine at UQ

The University of Queensland's School of Medicine is committed to delivering a world-class medical education, with the best outcomes for our students.

UQ offers the **Doctor of Medicine** program which has two options for entry:

Option 1 - Provisional Entry

- Student must be completing year 12 in the year they apply
- have an adjusted ATAR 95 (or equivalent), and
- Queensland Year 12 (or equivalent) English, and
- a competitive <u>University Clinical Aptitude Test for Australia and New Zealand (UCAT ANZ)</u> aggregate score from the year you apply, and
- attendance at a <u>multiple mini-interview (MMI)</u>

Option 2 - Graduate Entry

- a bachelor's degree (or equivalent) (known as a key degree), and
- a grade point average (GPA) of 5.0 on a 7-point scale in their key degree, and
- a minimum score of 50 in each section of the Graduate Medical School Admissions Test
 (GAMSAT) or for international applicants 504 in the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT),
 and attendance at a multiple mini-interview (MMI), and successful completion of the
 required MD subject prerequisite courses ***

Certificate IV in Cyber Security

This on campus cyber security course will provide students with the knowledge and skills needed to work in the field of cyber security. Throughout the course, students learn about different types of cyber threats and how to identify and protect against them. They also learn about the legal and ethical issues surrounding cyber security and how to respond to security incidents. Additionally, the course covers the principles of risk management and how to implement security controls to mitigate risks.

Snapshot of Monash University in 2023

- Named after engineer, military leader and public administrator Sir John Monash, Monash University was established in 1958.
- Monash University became a founding member of the Group of Eight universities in 1999.
- Monash ranks in the top 1% of world university rankings, and consistently ranks #44 in the world's top 100 universities - <u>Rankings. Notably</u>, Pharmacy at Monash is ranked #1 in the QS World University Rankings for Pharmacy and Pharmacology 2022 | Top Universities.
- Monash has over 77,000 students, with an international presence in <u>Malaysia</u>, <u>Indonesia</u>, <u>China</u>, <u>India (a research partnership)</u>, <u>and Italy</u>, besides its four campuses in Australia <u>-</u> locations.
- Monash University is the only Victorian university to offer a Direct Entry medical program
 for students completing Year 12 as well as a Graduate Entry program leading to the same
 degree <u>Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine (MD)</u>.
- There are ten <u>Monash Faculties</u> offering hundreds of <u>courses</u>, be they single or double undergraduate degrees, or graduate qualifications up to a PhD.
- Monash has a number of student-run clubs and associations a great way to get involved and meet people - Monash Clubs and Associations.
- <u>Career Connect</u> is the Career Centre available to all Monash students. Students can access the many services offered be it for volunteering, part-time jobs, assistance with applying for work on graduation, etc.
- The Monash <u>Study Abroad</u> program assists students in studying overseas as part of their course. Monash has exchange agreements with more than <u>160 universities across 35</u> <u>countries</u>.

- Monash offers more than 200 different scholarships for new and current students, from course fee subsidies to travel allowances, and payments for accommodation costs -<u>Scholarships.</u>
- <u>The Monash Guarantee</u> is an alternative entry scheme for students to get into a Monash course even they do not reach the course's clearly-in ATAR. Students may be eligible for the Monash Guarantee if they:
 - have experienced financial disadvantage
 - √ live in a low socio-economic area
 - ✓ are an Indigenous Australian
 - √ attend a Monash under-represented school
- Monash Residential Services assists students in finding accommodation on campus, and off campus.





Snapshot of Monash University – Peninsula in 2023

- Monash University's <u>Peninsula Campus</u> specialises in *nursing*, *physiotherapy*, *paramedicine*, occupational therapy, education, and business administration courses.
- There are approximately 4,500 students studying at the Peninsula Campus.
