School Recommendation Scheme will close on 19 September

A reminder that SRS applications through UAC close on 19 September. Schools Recommendation Scheme - UAC

Macquarie Leaders and Achievers has reopened and will close 19 September

The COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted the educational environment at schools and at universities over the last two years. Recent NSW Government announcements regarding delaying HSC written exams to 9 November has had significant impact on these students. At Macquarie University, we recognise the anxiety and uncertainty many Year 12 students face due to the current situation. We understand there is some concern around university offers and planning for tertiary and HSC studies, as well as planning for attending university. One of our most popular pathways is the Macquarie Leaders and Achievers Early Entry Scheme. Given the current situation in NSW, we have reopened this scheme for Year 12 students. Students can also still apply for early entry to Macquarie through the Schools Recommendation Scheme which also closes on Sunday 19 September. More information about Macquarie Early Entry.

UTS Early Entry Program closes on 12 September

When it was first introduced, the UTS Early Entry Program specified that conditional offers will be released on 5 October. These conditional offers were to become full offers (on 18th December) if a student completed the HSC **AND** met the ATAR requirements of at least 69 and 70 for Education courses.

There has been a change to this as follows:

- The date as to when the conditional offers become a full offer will now be pushed back to when students receive their ATAR this date is yet to be confirmed.
- If a student receives a conditional offer on 5 October, they no longer need to achieve an
 ATAR of 69 for this to become a full offer. You just need to complete the HSC and there is no
 longer a minimum ATAR requirement. Note that if a student is applying for any of their Education
 courses, they are still required to achieve an ATAR of 70. Also, not all courses, such as Law, are
 included in their eligible course list.

Macquarie recognises the significant impact this pandemic has had on students and the stress related to university entry for 2022. To reassure Year 12 students, all applicants applying for a Session 1, 2022 undergraduate degree will automatically receive five COVID-19 Impact Points to boost their selection rank. Prospective students will not have to apply for these additional adjustment factors as they will be automatically applied via their Universities Admission Centre (UAC) application. Find out more
