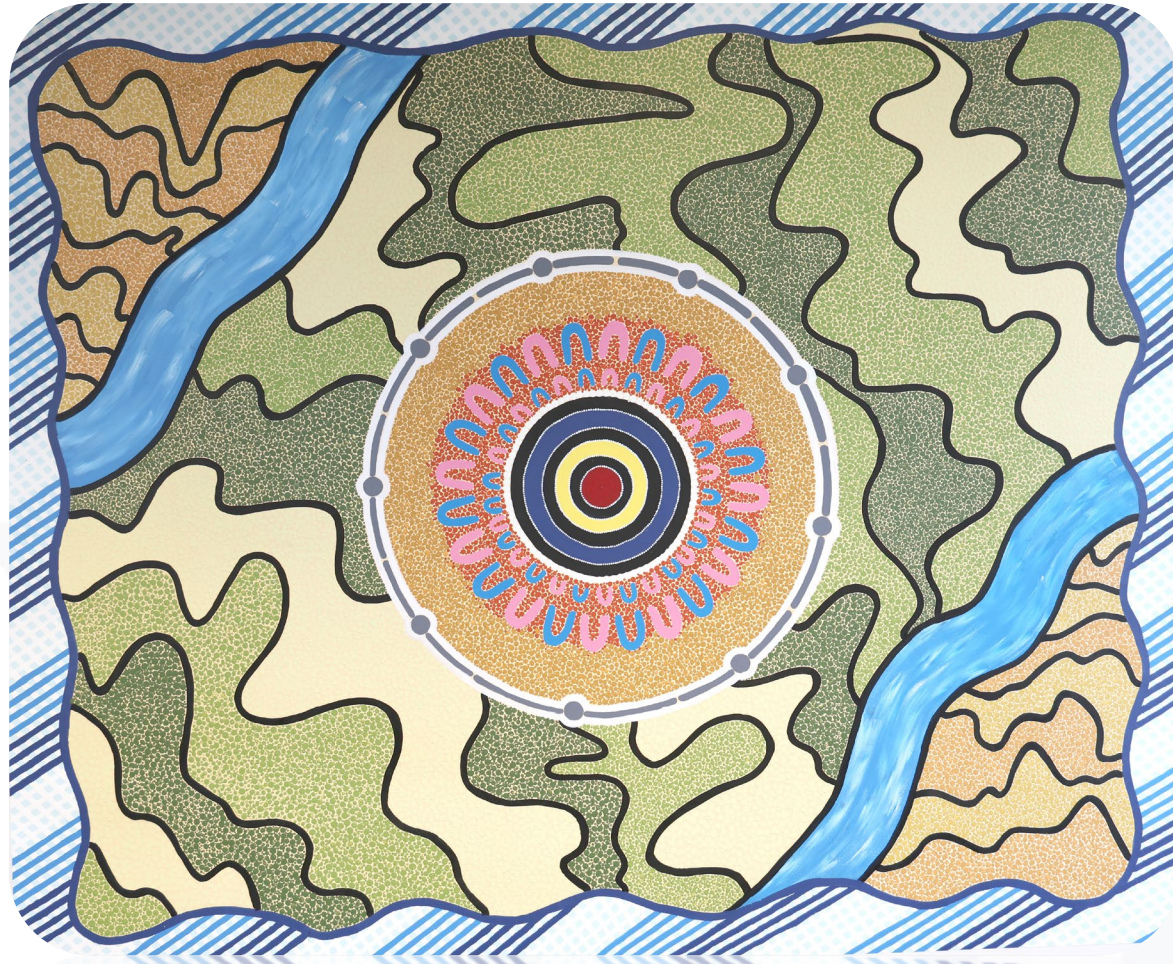

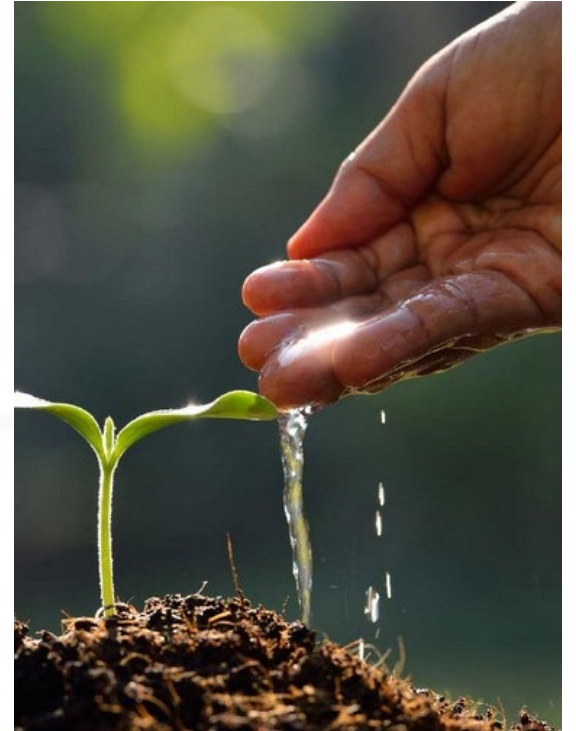

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# Immersion Overview

- Offered to Year 12 graduate students (departing late November).
- Ran in 2017, 2018 and 2019 – looking to restart in 2024.
  - 41 students have participated in the program since its inception.
- 16 – 18 day in northern Tanzania – Arusha City.
- Immersion experiences include time at the School of St Jude, at Edmund Rice Sinon Secondary School, and on safari through three national parks.



# Immersion Overview

- Goals include:
  - Cultivating a **greater appreciation** of the value of education and the resultant opportunities.
  - Providing an **authentic experience** of the various lifestyles in Tanzania, giving insights into the lives of the people.
  - Having an **opportunity for personal growth**: facing challenges and developing resilience.
  - **Giving witness** to Catholic social teaching: understand and explore the notions of **poverty, human dignity** and **cultural diversity**.

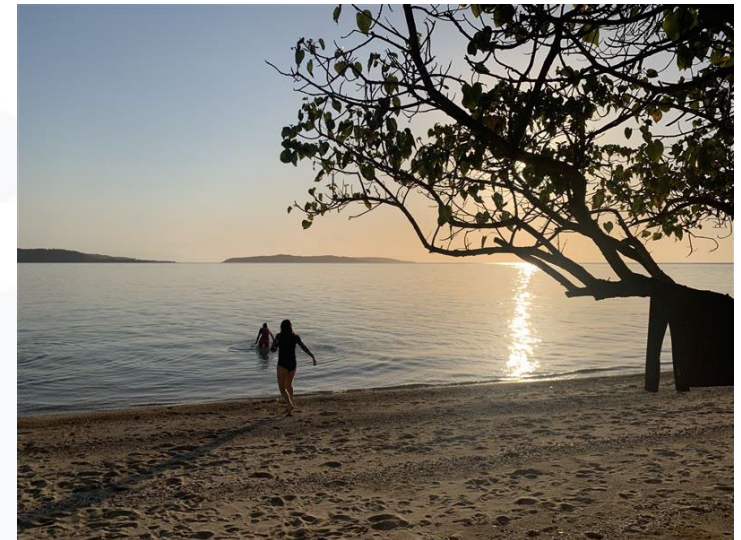

# SCHOOL BASED APPRENTICESHIPS (SBA)

- Must be 15 years of age – usually Year 11 & 12
- Combine studies with paid part time employment
- 'Hands on' industry experience
- Formal training included
- Arrangements discussed individually with students, parents/carers and employers

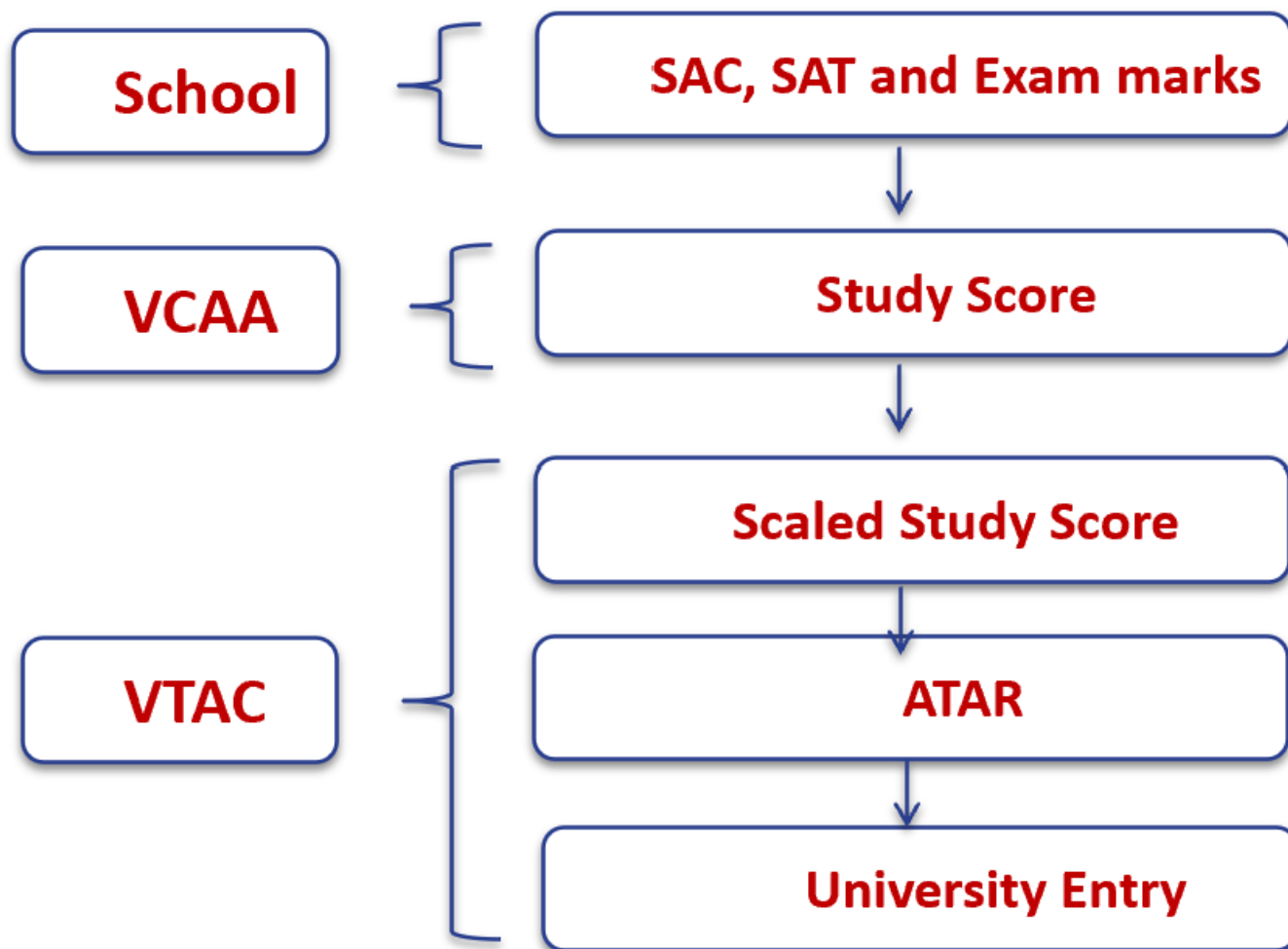

# WHAT IS A STUDY SCORE?

A score issued by VCAA for a particular



## What does it do?

- Ranks a student's performance in a study against everyone else in the state who completed that subject.
- Number between <15 and 50.
- eg. Compares all the students who studied Biology across state.

# What is ATAR?

Australian Tertiary Admissions Ranking



## Ranking applicable only used for Tertiary Courses

- Calculated by VTAC and allows universities to select students into courses.
- VCE students do not need to apply for an ATAR if they do not want to go to university.

# CALCULATION OF A STUDENT'S

A student gets the following scaled scores: 32 English, 36, 25, 28, 29, 30

Scaled score in English / Literature		<b>32</b>
Scaled scores of their next best three studies	plus	{ 36 30 29
10% of the scaled score of their 5th study	plus	2.8
10% of the scaled score of their 6th study		2.5
This total is converted to a ranking score based on a 100-point scale	<b>Total</b>	<b>132.3</b>



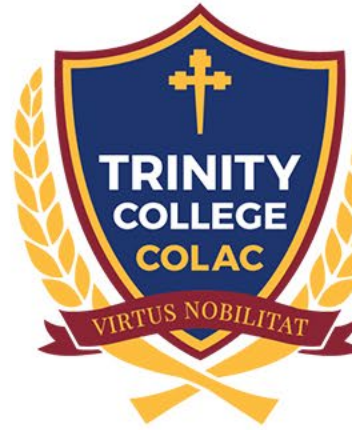
e.g. Student total of 208 may be 99.95, total 132.3 may be **77.5**

**77.5 ATAR** → A ranking which compares all students across all studies.

- Apply to further education through VTAC
- Students will register with VTAC
- Information from term 2
- Release ATAR results
- Encourage year 10, 11 and 12 students and families to explore the site and search for courses of interest

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# General Achievement Test

18 June 2024 – Trinity College Colac



- All students who undertake a Unit 3 and 4 subject must write the GAT (includes VET Sport and Recreation Students) and VCE-VM Numeracy and Literacy Students.
- The GAT is an essential component of students results.
- Includes all unscored students.

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# Special Exam Arrangements

## Who is eligible?

- mental health condition
- health impairment
- physical disability
- specific learning disorder
- language disorder
- hearing impairment
- vision impairment



# Special Exam Arrangements



## Examples of Provisions/Modifications for students

- extra working **time** (extra reading/writing time) in excess of 10min/hr
- **rest breaks** not exceeding 10 minutes per hour of the 'total examination writing time'
- **alternative format** examination papers such as enlarged print, and Braille
- assistive **Assistive Hearing Technology**: student with hearing impairment
- a **reader** or a scribe
- a **clarifier**, if the student has hearing impairment or language disorder
- an **alternative examination venue**, such as a separate room, a hospital

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# Rescheduling of Assessment Tasks

## Eligibility for rescheduling an assessment task

### Acceptable reasons (with necessary evidence):

- Medical reason (medical evidence must be provided)
- Traumatic circumstances (letter/other evidence)
- School reasons (such as excursions/Distance ED/SBA)  
*no evidence is required*

(Application form – PINK FORM - must be completed).



# Rescheduling of Assessment Tasks

## Eligibility for rescheduling an assessment task

Unacceptable reasons:

- Family holidays  
*receive a zero for the SAC/SAT but can redeem for a Satisfactory outcome result.*

# Rescheduling of Assessment Tasks



## Students to be responsible:

Time limit for application:

- Must apply within 48 hours of return to school
- Must complete assessment task within one month of return to school
- All rescheduled tasks are completed Tuesday 3.30pm

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# Victorian Certificate of Education - Vocational Major (VCE-VM)



- This pathway has been designed specifically for students in Years 11 and 12 who are interested in gaining Apprenticeships, Traineeships, or Full Time Employment on completion of their secondary schooling.
- The VM curriculum is largely Project Based with a strong focus on Teamwork, Time Management, Communication, Literacy, Numeracy, and Practical Skills deemed important for life and work beyond school.

# VCE VM Successful Completion



- To be successful in gaining a Certificate, VM students will need to be organised, and manage their time wisely.
- Keeping up with the considerable workload here at school on top of being out of school one or two, or even three days a week to satisfy TAFE, VET and/or work commitments is no easy feat. There is a **LOT** of work to keep up with.
- VM students need to complete **16 units of work** delivered in a structured **Unit 1 to 4** sequence across two years of senior schooling.

**\*As well as 180 hours of Vocational Education Training (VET)**

# VCE VM Successful Completion....



- 3 VCE VM Literacy or VCE English units (including 1 Unit 3 - 4 sequence)
- 2 VCE VM Numeracy or VCE Mathematics units
- 2 VCE VM Work Related Skills units
- 2 VCE VM Personal Development Skills units
- 2 VET credits at Certificate II level or above - 180 hours
- And 5 other Units, these can be VCE, VM or VET units, but at least 3 of them need to be Unit 3 - 4 sequences.
- \*VCE - VM Subjects are not 'scored' and therefore will not contribute to an ATAR

# Do VCE VM students sit the GAT?



YES....

Every student in Victoria who undertakes a Unit 3 or 4 subject must write the GAT!

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# VOCATIONAL EDUCATION TRAINING (VET) - What is VET?



- Students may undertake a VET course as part of their schooling from Year 10.
- VET Courses give students a god insight into industries with many students moving into a SBA or full time employment.
- Real 'hands on' practical training with less theory-based learning.
- Students gain workplace skills.

# VOCATIONAL EDUCATION TRAINING (VET) - Requirements



- VCE VM **must** include a VET option
- Students **must** complete a minimum of 180 hours to meet VCE requirements
- Students are responsible for catching on missed lessons
- Communication is vital
