> SUBJECT SELECTION IS COMING UP FAST...

Have you picked your subjects yet? Or perhaps you've got no idea what to choose?

There are two key things to note right at the start:

- 1. Your choices can affect your options for Year 12 and beyond.
- 2. If you stuff it up don't worry there's usually a way around it.

Choosing your senior subjects can be a big deal, so we've put together some thoughts to help you navigate the process.

Subject selection is important for a couple of reasons:

- 1. The subjects you pick may affect your ATAR
- 2. If you want to go to uni you may need to have taken certain courses at school (called prerequisites) to get into specific courses. For example, for engineering you generally need to study a higher level of maths and some sciences.

Technically, your subject choices could be the start of your career pathway. And for some people that's what happens...

BUT (and it's a really big but) if you don't pick the 'right' subjects at this stage then it doesn't mean your career is permanently derailed. If you don't take a subject now and realise when you apply for uni that it was essential then there are bridging courses you can take to get you up to speed quickly.

Remember: Very very few people have a clear idea of what they want to do when they 'grow up' at 15 years old.

And as for how your subject choices affect your ATAR – all the guidance from the experts says that you should never choose subjects to try and maximise your ATAR. For example, <u>VTAC</u> say:

"Selecting your VCE program based on studies that are scaled up will not guarantee you a high ATAR."

What does this mean? It means that you should pick what you want and not worry too much about whether or not you may need something for uni or to get a good ATAR.

Ok... so how should I choose my subjects?

The rules differ between each state, so check with your school to find out how many subjects you need to select to qualify for an ATAR/OP. Generally, you'll need to pick around 6 subjects to qualify.



You should choose subjects that:

- 1. You enjoy
- 2. You are good at
- 3. You find interesting
- 4. Give you choice down the track

There is lots of evidence to support that you will do better if you choose subjects you enjoy and are interested in.

How do I pick an English?

Pretty much everyone needs to study English to qualify for the ATAR. If you're not sure which one to pick, why not ask your teacher? They'll be able to give you a realistic idea of your abilities. There's usually a standard option and an advanced version, and the standard version is enough for just about every university course (which means if you don't love English, don't pick the advanced version).

What about maths?

I know you've heard this a hundred thousand times, but you'll use maths in an amazing number of ways throughout your life. So if you absolutely hate it and definitely don't want to study anything science, medical, engineering or maths related then don't take it. Otherwise, selecting at least the base level maths course is a good plan.

If there's a chance you'll want to study any kind of science, IT, business studies, PE, or even art then select maths.

What else?

There's an easy way to narrow down your list:

- 1. Print out a list of all the subjects you can choose from
- 2. Circle the English and maths subjects you've chosen
- 3. If you know what you'd like to study at uni, then circle the ones you have to do as prerequisites. You can get a list of prerequisites from the uni's website (we've put them together for you below)
- 4. Cross out any subjects you hate if you hate it now there's no way you'll do well in it
- 5. With a highlighter, select the subjects you love, as well as your best subjects
- 6. Out of what's left, underline any subjects that may be useful in the industry you think you want to enter
- 7. If you've selected too many then skip step 6.
- 8. By this point, you should only have a few left to select (if any) so go with your gut

Don't choose for the wrong reasons

This decision **will** have an impact on your future. There are some things you should definitely not consider when trying to select your subjects:

- 1. Your friend is/isn't picking it
- 2. You like/dislike the teacher
- 3. It's too easy/hard
- 4. You'll have to do an excursion or project for it



These are real world decisions that should be made with an **adult mindset**. If you're having a hard time deciding then ask an adult you trust to go through your choices with you. I'm certain that any adult you approached would be honoured to help you.
