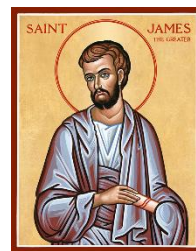

## PENTECOST SUNDAY

And all of them  
were filled  
with the  
Holy Spirit  
*Acts 2:4*



Pentecost Sunday is a major feast in the Christian Church celebrated on the fiftieth day after Easter. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on Mary, Jesus' mother, the Apostles and other disciples of Jesus Christ.

The name Pentecost comes from the Greek word "pentekostos" which means "fiftieth". The festival has its roots in the Jewish feast of "Shavuot" which was a thanksgiving for the first fruits of the wheat harvest and a remembrance of the Law given by God to Moses on Mt. Sinai.

Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Christian Church, as it marks the beginning of its mission to the world. According to the book of Acts in the New Testament, when the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples, they started speaking in different languages and proclaimed the Gospel to the crowds gathered in Jerusalem.

Pentecost is a celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit, who empowers and guides the Christian Church in its witness to the world. It is a time to remember the love of God, who sent His only Son for our redemption and His Spirit for our transformation.

## FIRST READING *Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11*

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles  
*They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.*

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
