This Term Our Learning Focus Is:

ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

- Building reading stamina
- Choosing 'good fit' texts
- Analysing characters and their traits
- Asking and answering comprehension questions literal, inferential and evaluative
- Completing responses to text including understanding author's purpose

Writing

- The structure of a narrative with particular emphasis on setting and character development
- Writing character profiles using the STEAL character framework
- Constructing and writing a persuasive text with clear arguments
- SMART spelling with a focus on a weekly sound and applying spelling strategies to personal writing
- Paragraphing, adjectives and time connectives

Speaking and Listening

- Engaging in whole class and small group discussions
- Sharing ideas and different points of view
- SRC speeches
- Using appropriate listening and speaking strategies

MATHEMATICS

Number and Algebra

- Understanding the value of numbers and the importance of the place of a number
- Odd and even numbers
- Reading and interpreting multi digit numbers
- Ordering numbers
- Using and implementing addition and subtraction strategies using their understanding of place value

Measurement and Geometry

- Reading and interpreting various maps using scale, legend, keys and grid references
- Creating our own map

Statistics and Probability

• Graphing reading stamina

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

- Exploring the scripture stories for Lent and Easter
- The Sacrament of Reconciliation and making good choices
- Reflect on the importance of forgiveness and reconciliation

INQUIRY LEARNING

- Rules and laws and how this impacts us
- Investigating 18th Century explorers, where they travelled, and what life was like
- First contact for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders with explorers and the impact this had on them with particular focus on cause and effect

<u>SEL</u>

- Zones of Regulation identifying the 4 zones with a focus on self awareness
- Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships Problem solving strategies for our self and in social situations

HOMEWORK

Homework will be handed out on Monday and returned the following Monday to allow flexibility in our busy lives. Homework is not to cause angst or distress for anyone in the family and is simply a tool to begin getting into good habits and for families to see what we are learning in class. If it causes any distress at home, please reach out to us.

Reading - this will always be the priority task

- Students will select a book of their choice and read for <u>15-20 minutes</u> per night which will be recorded in their diary and include the title and page numbers read.
- Families will support and encourage their child to read each night and sign their child's diary.

Then the following activities are expected to take NO LONGER than 10-15 minutes and to be completed at a time that suits your family unit and timetable.

Mathematics

• Students will have access to Mathletics (soon), in which assigned tasks will be relevant to the learning in the classroom. There may also be a small additional maths task on their homework sheet.

Spelling

- Students will practice their spelling words each night which relate to the SMART spelling focus within the classroom
- Students will also attempt 1-2 spelling activities each week which can be selected from the SMART spelling home learning grid (in the front of their homework book)

Inquiry / R.E. / STEM

• This will be an additional task relevant to the learning within the classroom, which will be a fun, engaging task which promotes family involvement and conversation.

Challenge Task: This is an optional only task that a student may like to complete.
