



The Adelaide Electronics industry is comprised of mostly small to medium sized companies which means they are very diverse in their products with a wide range of career opportunities. Further development of skills is encouraged to ensure adequate understanding of customers' needs. Most employers will provide support for this. Qualifications are portable so overseas experience can be gained. Opportunities to start your own business are available and a number of Adelaide companies have started this way.

STEM: This stands for **Science**, **Technology**, **Engineering** and **Mathematics**. To work in the Electronics industry it is important to have a good grounding in these areas. So, when you are choosing subjects make sure you include mathematics and physics at least. Check with your School Counsellor for the best combination for the tertiary course you wish to study.

Each dot represents an electronics company, around 300 altogether.

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This industry employs 11,000 people, mostly with medium to high level tertiary qualifications, who design and manufacture sophisticated equipment ranging from environmental management to diagnostic and therapeutic medical applications.

Most of the Intellectual Property is developed and owned by these companies. Intellectual property refers to the intelligence which is built into the equipment which enables it to perform tasks which give it an advantage over competitive products. This is in the form of software which is often written by electronics people. Because of its enabling and enhancing capability, electronics needs people who are not only trained in electronics but are able to understand its applications.

Courses range from apprenticeships to postgraduate University qualifications and are available on a full-time or part-time basis from TAFE and the Universities. Many can be done whilst working, often with some time release by employers. The South Australia electronics industry employs mostly Certificate 3 and upwards with the TAFE Advanced Diploma being a good starting pointasit can be built on with further study. THE ELECTRONICS INDUSTRY IN ADELAIDE

BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING: Larger hospitals have their own Biomedical Engineering departments which design and maintain diagnostic, life support and therapeutic equipment.

WEATHER RADAR: Aircraft are very dependent on radar for their safety via air traffic control and weather monitoring and wind-shear events.

COMMUNICATIONS: This can require specialised equipment with long range and reliability. Often there is a need to transmit data from remote locations so that processes can be monitored.

CUSTOM DESIGN AND MANUFACTURE: If a client needs a special device to do a specific job. Often the actual job will not be electronic but only electronics can provide the capability.

AGRICULTURE: Electronic equipment which measures moisture content will ensure that crops are dry enough to store and avoid the danger of spontaneous combustion.(eg Hay)

RUGGED COMPUTER SYSTEMS: Designed for harsh environments in industry, mining and defence.

MULTI-DISCIPLINARY RESEARCH AND DESIGN: In mechanical engineering and electronic systems.

DEVELOPMENT OF UNIQUE INTEGRATED CIRCUITS (ICs): Printed circuit assemblies for automotive, appliances, medical, industrial and defence.

Scholarship Value

The International College of Hotel Management is pleased to offer 4 major Australian Scholarships, for 2019 entry into the Bachelor of Business (Hospitality Management).

The value of each scholarship is A\$22,500 to be paid in the following manner:-

Year 1 A\$7,500 Year 2 A\$7,500 Year 3 A\$7,500

As well as the major scholarships, over the last 20 years ICHM has also awarded additional bursaries to deserving applicants.

Eligibility Requirements

- Citizens of Australia, both resident and non-resident. International students attending schools in Australia who complete a minimum of the last two years of their high school studies in Australia. Students attending Australian International Schools in Hong Kong, Singapore, Vietnam, Manila and Malaysia are also eligible to apply.
- Will complete in 2018 or have recently completed Year 12 or equivalent international schooling.
- Maximum age 22 at time of application.
- Open only to new students seeking entry into Year 1.
- For students whose mother tongue is other than English, refer to the ICHM website for IELTS or TOEFL requirements.

The Application form can be found in the ICHM Prospectus, or on the ICHM website. Make sure you make copies of your school reports and Reference Letter for both the ICHM Application Form, and also for Scholarship Application.

Note: Do not staple or bind applications. Do not send original transcripts as they will not be returned.

Applications close on Friday October 12th 2018 Applications received after the closing date will not be considered for these scholarships.

Step 3: Selection Process

Ten (10) Australian finalists will be invited to an interview in Adelaide, and an economy airfare will be provided to a maximum cost of A\$500 per applicant. Balance to be paid by applicant, or applicants can choose to be interviewed by video conference link.

Short Answer Questions	50%

Panel Interview 70% Short listing criteria 30%

Finalists for interviews will be advised by early in November 2018. Where possible, interviews will be conducted during late November/early December 2018 and winners advised immediately thereafter.

Winners will be selected by a panel considering the assessment criteria above and the "person/s most likely to excel at Hotel Management".

Conditions of Entry

These scholarships or bursaries can be applied to the ICHM tuition fees, uniforms or, on-campus accommodation fees (subject to availability).

Students who meet the scholarship eligibility criteria and ICHM entry requirements can apply for a scholarship. Students who have already applied and been accepted by ICHM for these intakes may also apply by completing the Scholarship Application form.

ICHM has two intakes in 2019. ICHM reserves the right to request winners to commence in the second 2019 intake, unless the applicant has been accepted into the first 2019 intake by scholarship closing date.

It is a condition of these scholarships that recipients commence in either the first or second intakes of 2019. Should a recipient wish to defer to a later entry than 2019, they will forfeit the scholarship or bursary amount.

Once a scholarship recipient has commenced their studies at ICHM, unless they have applied to ICHM in writing and been granted a scholarship deferment, any deferral or withdrawal will result in a forfeiture of the remaining scholarship or bursary amount. Even if they return to ICHM at a later date, they have forfeited their scholarship.

ICHM reserves the right to reduce the value of scholarships if there are less than ten applicants in Australia.

ICHM has been approved by the Australian Government as a FEE-HELP provider. This allows students to borrow money from the Government to fund their studies at ICHM; it is only available to Australian citizens. For more information please follow the links on the ICHM website.

The Selection Panel may decide to increase the number of scholarship winners by reducing the scholarship amount.

Payment of the scholarship amount on behalf of the student for Years 2 and 3 of the course will be dependent upon satisfactory academic results and industry placement performance as determined by the ICHM Academic Board.

The awarding of the Scholarship payment each year depends on the student paying the balance of the fees as outlined in the prospectus and by the due date in their invoice. Students failing to pay the balance of fees by the invoice due date will forfeit their right to their scholarship or bursary amount.

The Scholarships are open to new Year 1 students only. Students currently studying at ICHM are ineligible.

Scholarship students failing to comply with the ICHM rules and regulations in relation to personal and ethical behaviour will forfeit their entitlement to the scholarship.
