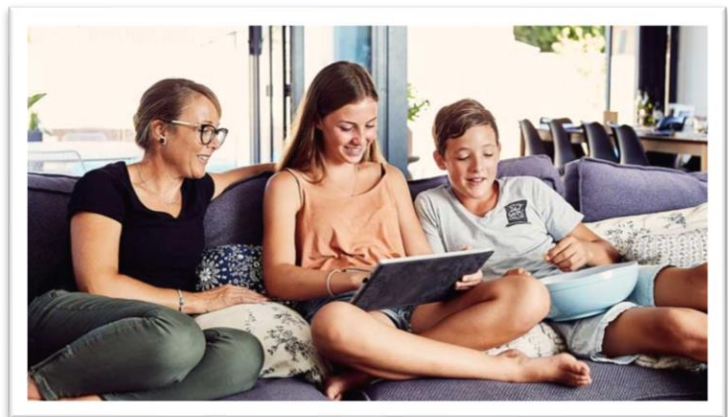

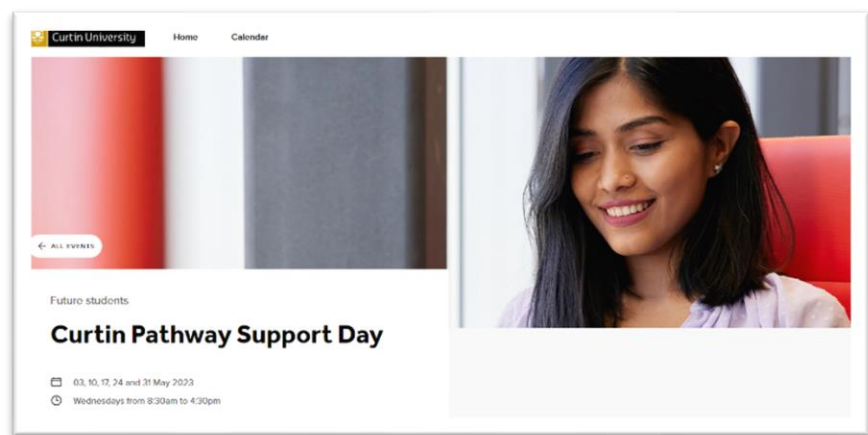

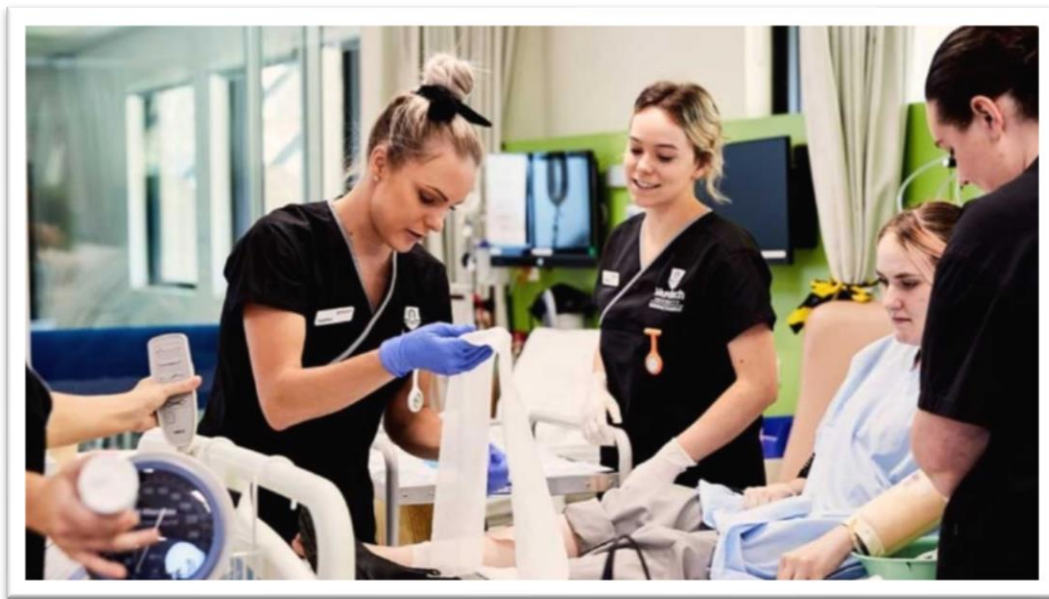

Curtin Scholarships 2024

ATAR Achievement Scholarships

(This one is fairly easy to achieve.)

Application forms are not required, **students apply by selecting an eligible Curtin course through TISC as their first preference.**

The scholarship will reward applicants who achieve an ATAR 3 points higher than their predicted ATAR, based on year 11 studies, and who want to pursue study at Curtin University.

Employment outcomes for international Vocational Education and Training (VET) Students

In mid-2022, 83.0% of international onshore VET students were employed after training, up 7.5 percentage points from the same period in 2021. A total of 81.3% were employed in Australia, which was 8.5 percentage points higher than in the previous year.

Overall, 73.0% of international onshore VET qualification completers had an improved employment status after training, an increase of 8.9 percentage points from 2021.
