Applying for a Tax File Number (TFN)

Any student will need a tax file number if he/she starts work (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they cannot enrol in a CSP (Commonwealth Support Place) course at university without a Tax File Number, so it is worthwhile getting an application submitted early!

Students must apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.

What is a Freelance Journalist?

A freelance journalist is a writer who is self-employed. They complete contract work, single pieces or regular assignments for newspapers, magazines, companies, and other organizations.

They often sell their services or work by the piece, by the hour or by the day—sometimes freelance journalists even sell their work by the word. In other words, a freelance journalist is not committed to one employer long-term and works independently.

Career as an Anthropologist

According to the Good Universities Career Guide, [anthropologists](#) *study the origin, development and functioning of human societies and cultures, as they exist now or have existed throughout history. Anthropologists are concerned with the complexities of social and cultural life, including religion, rituals, family and kinship systems, languages, art, music, symbolism, and economic and political systems.*

Successful anthropologists –

- Have the capacity for detailed observation and accurate practical work
- Can work independently
- Have enthusiasm for research
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Sensitive to other people and cultures.

To become an anthropologist, students usually have to complete a degree in *science, arts, social science or international studies* at university with a major in anthropology (preferably at honours level), followed by a postgraduate qualification in anthropology.

AIM has campuses in Sydney and Melbourne, and courses offered in Melbourne include:

[Bachelor of Arts and Entertainment Management](#) – a 3-year course for anyone wanting to master the essentials of the music business – from marketing and artist management to music business economics and law.

[Bachelor of Music \(Composition\)](#) – a 3-year course training students to become a composer with originality, heightened musical ability, and technical mastery. As digital media expands, so does the demand for talented composers in film, television, video games, and music.

[Bachelor of Music \(Performance\)](#) – a 3-year course whereby students get to refine their musicianship, develop their collaboration skills, and help them stand out as a performer. With both a contemporary and classical pathway, graduates will emerge with the skills and confidence to perform on stage and in the studio.

[Bachelor of Music Theatre](#) – a 3-year course preparing students to land leading roles, play in ensembles, and generate original theatre works as they steadily build their professional performance skills. They will build the skills to command the stage with confidence, building the ‘triple skill set’ – singing, dancing and acting.
