Theory Sessions (Unmounted)

If you are interested in your child either joining or continuing Junior Horsemanship (Prep to Yr 5), please complete the attached form and return it to Junior Campus Reception. During Term 3 a horsemanship theory program will be offered over the winter period which will be unmounted so students will not require a horse to ride. Please indicate your interest in this program on the form below.

Horsemanship lessons cover riding, saddling, grooming and care of the horse. Junior Horsemanship runs in Terms 1, 2 and 4. During Term 2 we are also offering our junior students Parelli style lessons for riders who may be interested in this alongside the other experience based lessons. Throughout Term 1, 2 & 4 Horsemanship lessons are held on Wednesday afternoons from 3:45 – 5:30pm. Students are walked across from the Myrning Homestead to the Equestrian Centre at 3:30pm. Lessons commence on the second Wednesday of term continuing through until, and including, the last week of term. Students are divided into experience based groups and these groups are organized at the first session of each term. These groups may be altered for the different activities run across the term.

Parents are welcome to attend Horsemanship lessons and help their children. However, it is essential that parents respect that the instructor who is in charge of the group lesson. All involved must wear suitably tough and comfortable footwear.

Beginner riders, and riders who are unable to ride independently, will require an adult leader. Unfortunately, it is not possible for the instructor to lead a beginner whilst teaching other members of the group.

Children will be collected from the front on the Myrning Homestead and taken to the Equestrian Centre as a group. Students may change in the kitchen at Horsemanship or in their own float. They then have time to have a quick snack before their lesson. Please remind your child/children to leave the kitchen tidy if they are using this facility.

As part of the riding programme, students will be expected to learn to prepare their own pony for riding, including saddling-up. The instructors will assist with this as part of the lesson. Students will meet in the sand arena and then start ridden activities with their instructor at 4.00pm. Riding will conclude at approx 5:00pm. At this time, students will unsaddle, cool down, groom and rug their horses. Generally students will be ready to leave the Equestrian Centre by approx. 5.30pm.

If you are doubtful regarding Horsemanship being held on a particular night due to the weather, please contact The Director of Horsemanship Amanda te Boekhorst on **0429 624 928** or email equestrian@hamiltoncollege.vic.edu.au Horsemanship will be cancelled in days of high heat, or if we experience any extreme weather such as wind, lightning or thunder storms.
