

First Reading

Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7

The Lord God fashioned man of dust from the soil. Then he breathed into his nostrils a breath of life, and thus man became a living being. The Lord God planted a garden in Eden which is in the east, and there he put the man he had fashioned. The Lord God caused to spring up from the soil every kind of tree, enticing to look at and good to eat, with the tree of life and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil in the middle of the garden. The serpent was the most subtle of all the wild beasts that the Lord God had made. It asked the woman, 'Did God really say you were not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?' The woman answered the serpent, 'We may eat the fruit of the trees in the garden. But, of the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden God said, "You must not eat it, nor touch it, under pain of death".' Then the serpent said to the woman, 'No! You will not die! God knows in fact that on the day you eat it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods, knowing good and evil.' Catechumens: Margaret Grech, Junghee Youm, Dhaneshi Mannapperuma

Rite of Sending, 9 am Mass, St Thomas the Apostle Parish.— The Rite of Sending offers the parish community an opportunity to acknowledge the spiritual progress the catechumens have made, express approval of their election or recognition, and send them forth to our bishop. To send a catechumen to the bishop means that a parish has discerned that the person is ready to enter the Catholic Church and assurance them with our care and support.

<u>Rite of Election, 3 pm – St Mary's Cathedral, Sale.-</u> The Rite of Election signifies that the catechumens have been called and claim by Christ. The community with godparents, representing the parish, will testify the participant's readiness. It is appropriate for the bishop to recognize them because he is the sign of unity of the church and it is the parish community's responsibility to bring them into the fullness of the life of the church. The participation of the Catechumens in the rite of election also means that they have reached their final decision to enter the catholic Church. From this point forward, they will be called the Elect and their final preparation during Lent will lead to their sacramental initiation at Ester Vigil.
