The primary purpose of the camp is to allow students to further build on the relationships they have forged with their peers in 2014, and to meet and make friends with other students. Also, there will be a real emphasis on 'teamwork', with students involved in many activities requiring teamwork. It is a tremendous opportunity to be exposed to, and learn from, a number of different experiences, and to take part in a variety of enjoyable activities. Importantly, a number of Year 8 staff will be in attendance, which gives students a chance to better know some of their teachers. Staff and students can construct relationships, which can have positive benefits in the classroom in 2015, and beyond.

A number of staff will be involved in the camps, and they will work closely with on-site facilitators, and outside activity operators who are qualified in their various fields. This is the range of activities that will be provided:

In mixed groups of approximately 25 - 30, students will rotate through a series of activities including:

- Initiative games
- Swimming
- High and low ropes
- Surfing
- Surf Carnival
- Ball games
- Video/trivia session
- Mountain bike riding
- Trampolining

Activities such as surfing, swimming and river kayaking will occur off the camp site. Transportation to these activities will require the use of the Camp Wilkin bus, and another local bus company.

CLOTHING LIST
