



We can change a number, so you can change your life

At Monash, we know that your ATAR might not accurately reflect your ability. Life can be a bumpy road, and there are all sorts of circumstances that can get in the way of your academic achievement.

By considering your circumstances as part of your application, we create a level playing field for everyone who aspires to an exceptional education. We operate two schemes – the Monash Guarantee and the Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) – that can help you enter your preferred course, even if your ATAR is below the clearly-in.

If you're inspired by big ideas and fired with ambition, you'll fit right in at Monash. The uni you want might not be out of reach.

SPECIAL ENTRY ACCESS SCHEME (SEAS)

SEAS adjusts your ATAR in recognition of circumstances that may have affected your education. This gives you a better chance of getting an offer for the course you want.

You'll receive additional points depending on the severity of your circumstances. The points are added to your combined study scores, and your ATAR is recalculated.

Monash uses this adjusted ATAR during the selection process.

Eligibility

To be eligible for SEAS, you must:

- satisfy the criteria for one or more of the SEAS categories:
 - _ financial disadvantage
 - _ Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
 - _ live in a low socio-economic area
 - _ attend a school in a regional or remote location
 - _ born in a non-English-speaking country and moved to Australia after 1 January 2012
 - _ experienced difficult personal circumstances
 - _ disability or medical condition
 - _ aged 21 or older on 1 January 2018
- be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or hold an Australian permanent resident or permanent humanitarian visa.

THE MONASH GUARANTEE

The Monash Guarantee can get you into a Monash course even if you don't reach the course's clearly-in ATAR. You could be eligible for the Monash Guarantee if you:

- have experienced **financial disadvantage**
- are an **Indigenous Australian**
- attend a Monash **under-represented school**
- live in a **low socio-economic area**.

How it works

Every Monash University course has a Monash Guarantee ATAR. You'll find them listed in the table opposite. The Monash Guarantee ATAR is lower than the expected clearly-in for that course.

For most courses, if you meet the criteria, achieve the Monash Guarantee ATAR and complete all course prerequisites, you'll be eligible for a place at Monash. There are some exceptions – it's all explained in the table.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the Monash Guarantee, you must:

- be studying an Australian Year 12 or International Baccalaureate in 2017
- meet the Monash Guarantee ATAR for your preferred course
- satisfy all course-specific prerequisites and requirements, such as the UMAT, a portfolio, interview or audition
- be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent resident or permanent humanitarian visa
- demonstrate that you have experienced financial disadvantage; currently attend a Monash-listed under-represented school; are an Indigenous Australian; or live in a low socio-economic area.

Financial disadvantage

To demonstrate financial disadvantage, you must have documents that prove at least one of the following:

- You receive an income-tested Centrelink benefit (e.g. Youth Allowance or Abstudy).
- Your parents/guardians receive an income-tested Centrelink benefit (e.g. Family Tax Benefit A).
- You and/or your family are facing financial hardship or excessive financial obligations (e.g. living on a farm suffering from drought or floods).

Indigenous Australian

Monash benefits from a diverse student body that includes Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. If you're an Indigenous Australian, and you meet the required ATAR, you'll be eligible for the Monash Guarantee.

Under-represented school

Monash has identified more than 1000 schools across Australia as being under-represented at university. If you attend one of these schools and meet the required ATAR, you'll be eligible for the Monash Guarantee. Find the list at: monash.edu/guaranteedentry

Low socio-economic area

If you live in a low socio-economic area and meet the required ATAR, you'll be eligible for the Monash Guarantee. Find out if your address qualifies at: monash.edu/seas

TWO SCHEMES? WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

In simple terms, the Monash Guarantee promises entry at a lower ATAR, while the Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) adjusts your ATAR. Operating both schemes ensures we can help as many students as possible.

In both cases, you must still meet any other requirements your course might have. (For example, you must pass the UMAT to enter medicine, and audition to enter music.)

WHICH SCHEME AM I ELIGIBLE FOR?

You don't have to choose between them – depending on your situation and background, you could be eligible for one, the other, or both. All Victorian universities use SEAS, while the Monash Guarantee is Monash-specific. All you need to do is apply, and leave the rest to VTAC and us.

GUARANTEED SCHOLARSHIPS

If you've experienced financial disadvantage, you'll receive a minimum \$1000 scholarship in your first year at Monash, and \$500 in every following year. You'll also be considered for a range of other scholarships if you submit your scholarship application through VTAC. It's just one way we support you to get the most out of your Monash experience.

HOW TO APPLY

- Complete a course application via VTAC. Once submitted, you will have access to complete the Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) application.
- You will be assessed for SEAS and the Monash Guarantee based on your SEAS application.

Remember to include any documents VTAC asks you to provide, and list your preferred courses in your preference list.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Do I have to put my Monash Guarantee course as my first preference?

You should always put the course that you most want to study as your first preference. If a Monash Guarantee course is on your preference list but not first, you'll only receive an offer for it if you don't get offered a place for a course higher on your list.

We can only offer you a place through the Monash Guarantee or SEAS if the relevant course is included in your preference list.

Note that the Monash Guarantee is only applicable for round one offers. Entry isn't guaranteed if you change your preferences after round one offers.

Will my SEAS-adjusted ATAR be used for the Monash Guarantee?

No. The Monash Guarantee provides guaranteed entry based on your achieved ATAR – the original ATAR you receive when results are released, before any SEAS bonus is added.

How do I know if I live in a low socio-economic area?

You can find out if your address qualifies at monash.edu/seas.

Eligibility is according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics Socio-Economic Indexes for Areas.

Do I still have to meet prerequisites for my course if I'm eligible for the Monash Guarantee?

Yes, you must still meet all course prerequisites (e.g. minimum study scores in particular subjects) and extra requirements (such as the UMAT or an audition) to be eligible for a course offer through the Monash Guarantee.

Which campus can I study at if I enter via the Monash Guarantee?

The Monash Guarantee ATAR applies to every Australian campus on which the course is taught. Visit study.monash to find out where the courses you're interested in are taught.

What if I don't meet the Monash Guarantee ATAR?

You can still be considered for entry through the normal selection process and SEAS.

How many SEAS bonus points will I get, and how is this determined?

Your circumstances are considered individually and points awarded based on the information you provide in your SEAS application. Our SEAS calculator helps you estimate your adjusted ATAR: monash.edu/seas. But remember, this is just an estimate.

When will I know if I'm guaranteed a course offer through the Monash Guarantee?

We'll send you a confirmation email in December (before you get your results) if you meet the eligibility criteria and have a Monash course listed in your preferences. If you achieve the required ATAR and meet all course requirements you'll then receive your official course offer in January.

APPLYING INTERSTATE TO MONASH UNIVERSITY IN MELBOURNE, AUSTRALIA

Applying to study at Monash is similar to applying to university through SATAC. This guide will give you tips on how to apply through VTAC for Monash courses and scholarships, it also features information on accommodation and SACE score conversions.

WHAT IS VTAC (VICTORIAN TERTIARY ADMISSIONS CENTRE)?

VTAC is the Victorian version of SATAC, who are responsible for processing applications and offers for places in Victorian universities. The two centres operate independently. The offer you receive from VTAC does not impact your offer from SATAC.

Important tip

When registering at vtac.edu.au, use an email account that you will have access to well into next year, as important documents will be sent to you in 2018. Your school email account may not be suitable as you may no longer have access in the new year.

SEAS (Special Entry Access Scheme)

The Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) provides special admission consideration if you are a student who has experienced disadvantage. SEAS recognises that your potential for university study may not be reflected in your achieved ATAR due to a range of circumstances. Through SEAS, bonus points are added to your aggregate study score to recalculate your ATAR and increase your chances of receiving an offer.

You may be eligible for SEAS if your background includes any of the following:

- Indigenous Australian
- non-English speaking background
- financial disadvantage
- disability or medical condition
- school and home location

Applications for SEAS are made through VTAC after you have submitted your course preferences.

The Monash Guarantee

The Monash Guarantee can get you into a Monash course even if you don't reach the course's clearly-in ATAR. You could be eligible for the Monash Guarantee if you:

- have experienced financial disadvantage

- attend a Monash listed under-represented school

To apply for the Monash Guarantee, you must:

- submit a VTAC course application and include your preferred Monash University courses in your preference list
- complete a Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS) application including any required documentation

PREREQUISITES

To be accepted into Monash University, you will need to satisfy course entry requirements. Some courses may have higher entry requirements, prerequisites or extra selection requirements such as interviews and folios. Check the course entry in study.monash to see what you need, including prerequisite subjects such as:

- English
- Mathematics
- Science

Keep in mind that entry requirements are listed in terms of VCE subject and required VCE scores. To determine the SACE equivalent scores see the table below.

MONASH RELOCATION GRANT

This grant has been introduced to support students who are relocating from interstate to commence an undergraduate degree at Monash University in Australia. You may be eligible if you are either:

- financially disadvantaged
- from a Monash listed under-represented school (MURS)
- an Indigenous Australian.






New Scholarships Available


