New Bachelor of Digital Construction Management

Commencing in 2022, Swinburne will be offering the *Bachelor of Digital Construction Management*. This course will equip students with skills to *learn to identify and use various* digital technologies and sophisticated techniques including modelling and simulations for a range of construction management aspects such as time, cost, quality, productivity, safety and sustainability.

This degree will also include guaranteed real industry experience in the form of placements, internships, or industry-linked projects. Graduates of the course will be able to pursue careers in a range of professional roles such as construction management, measuring and

estimating, cost planning and controlling, quantity surveying, building surveying, construction planning, project scheduling, project management, quality and safety management, construction site operations and supervision, procurement and project delivery, contract administration, risk management, building information modelling and application of digital technologies in construction.

The VCE prerequisite: Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 25 in English other than EAL or at least 30 in English (EAL). Students who attain an ATAR of 65.00 or higher and complete all the requirements for this course, you will be guaranteed an offer.

> The Future Leaders Scheme

The University of Sydney's <u>Future Leaders Scheme</u> recognises leadership and academic achievement. The Future Leaders Scheme recognises these qualities and allows **school captains and dux students** to gain entry to eligible courses with a lower ATAR.

Eligible courses available through the Future Leaders Scheme and the ATAR requirements can be browsed below:

- Architecture, design and planning
- Arts and social sciences
- Business
- Education and social work
- Engineering and computer science
- Law
- Medicine and health
- Science
- Excluded courses

School captains

To be considered for the scheme, you are required to submit documentation that demonstrates your appointment as school captain in your application. Accepted supporting documentation examples include:

- Letter (on official letterhead) signed by your career advisor, Year 12 coordinator or principal, which confirms your appointment as school captain
- An official report card that confirms your appointment as school captain.

Complete the University of Sydney <u>application form</u> by the closing date and place the course you wish to be considered for under the Future Leaders Scheme as your highest UAC preference in the main offer round for school leavers (December Round 2). Applications are open, and close on **29 November 2021**.

Dux student

Dux students are not required to submit support documentation as they will be automatically selected for the scheme.

> Academic Excellence Scheme

Recognising achievement by rewarding academic excellence. The Academic Excellence Scheme recognises high performance in English and mathematics by applying adjustment factors to boost your selection rank.

The **Academic Excellence Scheme** was introduced in recognition of domestic students who achieve high performance in higher levels of English and mathematics by applying adjustment factors to boost their selection rank for eligible courses. A student's ATAR will not change, however, their selection rank can increase for particular courses based on these subject-related adjustment factors.

To be eligible, VCE students must attain a minimum study score of 35 in English or Literature, and a minimum study score of 35 in Maths Methods or Specialist Maths. There is no separate application. Students who are eligible, and who have applied through UAC to study at the University of Sydney will automatically be considered.
