# Admissions

## Overview & Timeline

- **1 March 2023** - Applications Open
- **15 May 2023** - Applications close
- **22 May 2023** - Document upload closes for Year 11 results, Co-Curricular activities and supporting documents for adjustment factors
- **4 September 2023** - Offers released (September round, based on Year 11 results)
- **4 October 2023** - Offer acceptance deadline (September round)
- **1 November 2023** - Change of preference reopens for all programs except for Bachelor of Health Science
- **1 November 2023** - Document upload reopens for Year 11 results, Co-Curricular activities and supporting documents for adjustment factors
- **10 November 2023** - Deadline to add Bachelor of Visual Arts or Bachelor of Design as a preference\*\*
- **30 November 2023** - Deadline to add Bachelor of Philosophy (Honours) - Science and Bachelor of Philosophy (Honours)- Humanities and Social Sciences as a preference\*\*

## Important points to advise applicants

- We encourage all applicants to submit as soon as possible; this maximises the time we have to communicate with students if they need to supply anything further for their application.
- Applicants can continue to upload supporting documents after submission until the document upload deadline (May 22).
- Scholarship and program preferences can be changed until the application deadline.
- Accommodation preference cannot be changed after submission.
- All applicants (except NSW/ACT applicants) must upload Year 11 results. We recommend applicants use our template to ensure we get all the data we need. NSW/ACT schools need to ensure Year 11 results are correct and available by the end of March.
- All applicants (except NSW applicants) must upload Year 12 enrolments if they are applying to a program with a prerequisite. We recommend applicants use our template to ensure we get all the data we need.
- Successful completion of English and Maths is no longer required for entry for 2024 (except for programs with prerequisites).
- Students need to accept both the early offer and the final offer. They can only have one offer active in the system. If an applicant changes preferences and receives a different final offer, we will only honour the final offer.
- Applicants who apply directly to ANU should not list ANU as a preference in UAC.
- All ANU documents should be uploaded to their ANU application, not their UAC application.
- EAS documents with either UAC or ANU letterhead will be accepted for ANU.

## Important points to advise applicants

### Tuckwell Scholarships:

- Head of Year (HoY) references will only be sought for long-listed candidates
- Stage 1 outcomes will be released on 15 May
- Principal references will only be sought for short-listed (i.e. Stage 2) candidates
- Stage 2 outcomes will be released on 15 June
- Tuckwell Interview Weekend (i.e. Stage 3) will be held over Friday 7 to Sunday 9 July

### ANU Scholarships:

- The information collected during the application process is used to determine scholarship selection
- We recommend that all students tick 'Yes, I wish to be considered for scholarships' when applying at ANU
  - This answer can be changed up until applications close on 15 May
- ANU offers many scholarships on equity and diversity grounds; not all scholarships are determined by academic merit
- All scholarships will be offered as early as possible, according to their Conditions of Award (CoA)
- Scholarships based on final ATAR will only be offered once ATARs become available
- CoAs and scholarship values/numbers available are under review but will be published prior to the release of early offers

There are a small number of scholarships that have an additional application process--if students are identified as eligible, they may receive an invitation to apply

# Accommodation

## Overview & Timeline

### Accommodation Guarantee

ANU guarantees an offer of accommodation in one of our **Residences** or **other approved accommodation** to all of the following undergraduate students commencing in the first semester of their first year of study in 2023 at the Australian National University:

*Indigenous students, Students with a disclosed disability, Tuckwell Scholars, Incoming exchange students, First-year, first-semester domestic undergraduate students, First-year, first-semester international undergraduate students, Transferring students from another Institution, ANU Medical School students, ANU College Foundation Program (Standard program - February commencement only) and up to 50 local places for residents of the ACT or surrounds who live in a suburb which has one of the following postcodes: 0200, 0221, 2600-2612, 2614-2620, 2900-2914*

### Prices

ANU offers a broad range of accommodation choices to fit within various budgets. Variety of bursaries and scholarships is also available to support students with accommodation costs.

Costs range from \$260pw for non-catered residence to \$500 for our catered residence. Full Fee Summary for 2023 can be found on our [website](#).

Both prices and guarantee may be subject to change for 2024 term.

### Yukeembruk Village

Yukeembruk consists of over 700 beds with rooms that have shared bathroom facilities or ensuite rooms and self-catered masterchef style kitchens. The four residential buildings are built around a large common amphitheatre, creating a village community with views of Sullivan's Creek, Black Mountain and the lake.

### Yukeembruk Features

*Standard rooms with shared bathrooms, Studio apartments with ensuite bathrooms, Self-catered with multiple master-chef style kitchens, Art & Music Rooms, BBQ areas in main courtyards, Outdoor exercise equipment including half basketball court, Internet, Multiple small and large study spaces, Large central flexible use space – communal village hall, No Smoking, Accessibility / Mobility Friendly, Communal Village green, Laundry facilities, Academic support, Wellbeing care, Computer lab, CCTV surveillance, Secured access to buildings, Multiple undercover and secure bicycle storage facilities, Parking (very limited paid resident permit parking nearby)*

### Application Advice

Applications for 2024 traditionally open in September. Once the application is submitted, nothing further is required. Accommodation applications are reviewed equally and are not assessed on a first-come, first-serve system. We will make offers in January on progressive basis until we have placed all guaranteed students in a room. We will then offer to non-guaranteed applicants.

### Bachelor of Arts

Graduates of Arts degree have a wide range of career opportunities available to them. ### Bachelor of International Relations

Graduates of BIR have wide range of career opportunities in the fields of diplomacy, government, international organizations, NGOs, journalism, and business. They can pursue careers as diplomats, political analysts, policy advisers, intelligence officers, international development consultants, journalists, or business consultants. They could also work for international organizations such as the United Nations, the World Bank, or the International Monetary Fund. With their knowledge of foreign languages, cultures and global issues, they can play a vital role in shaping the world's political, economic, and social landscape. This degree that prepares you to enter a range of fields including public policy and internationally oriented employment. Graduates may find work in government, foreign affairs,

journalism, policy making, non-government organisations, private business, tourism, trade and many other fields.

### Bachelor of Politics, Philosophy and Economics

### Bachelor of Design/Visual Arts Application - Portfolio & Interview

- **Step 1:** Apply B Design/Visual Arts to ANU through UAC
- **Step 2:** Register with ANU School of Art & Design for portfolio and interview

- Early Sep 2023, Interview registration & portfolio submission opens
- Mid Nov 2023, Interview registration & portfolio submission deadline

#### Requirements:

The portfolio is your opportunity to demonstrate your passion and potential. Where it is not practical to include actual work in the portfolio, photographs or digital images of the work are acceptable.

Applicants are not required to have studied or have experience in the area(s) of their choice. Rather, applicants must demonstrate an aptitude for creativity which will highlight their ability.

Works included in your portfolio and presented at interview do not necessarily need to be finished works - the aim is to tell your story and demonstrate your interests and approaches to art and design.

**Portfolio format:** medium-physical/digital

B Design: Drawing, models/prototypes, websites, magazines, books, animation, video, photography, games, interactive apps, etc. demonstrate your interest and ability to think analytically.

B Visual Arts: Drawings, designs and sketches, physical models, maquettes, 2D work, 3D work, computer graphics, videos, animations, websites, sound works, photographs, documentation of audio-visual or performance work, visual diary, journal and/or blog/social media site.

### Bachelor of Music Application - Portfolio & Auditions

**Step1:** Apply B Music to ANU through UAC

**Step2:** Create an Embark Account

Create an (2023 Embark Link coming soon) to register for an audition and/or to upload a portfolio of works.

#### Performance Auditions

To be accepted into the **Performance Major or Minor** students will need to pass audition. All students who successfully audition will be automatically considered for relevant scholarships. When applying for an ANU Bachelor degree program, you may be eligible to receive performance-based adjustments of up to 5 points.

Portfolios for **Composition, Composition for Film and Video Games, Musicology and Music Technology Majors** is strongly encouraged but not mandatory. Applicants with no prior experience

may submit a statement of interest in lieu of a portfolio. Applicants may submit between 1-3 scores and/or recordings of their work that they feel best represents their recent output. Submitted works may be in any musical style. Recordings are optional but not required. Applicants should also submit a writing sample of 250 words on a topic of your choice, chosen from; a statement of your compositional goals, a short essay of your musical influences, a recent analysis essay in music theory or history, program notes from an original composition, a statement on how you plan to use your ANU training in your future career path.

### Bachelor of Accounting

The Bachelor of Accounting is designed to develop your knowledge and skills in reporting, analysing and managing financial resources in business and government entities.

### Bachelor of Actuarial Studies

(Prerequisite: Specialist Math or equivalent)

The Bachelor of Actuarial Studies combines skills from mathematics, statistics, economics and finance to assess, evaluate and manage future financial risk, thereby addressing a wide range of practical problems in long-term financial planning and management.

### Bachelor of Business Administration

The Bachelor of Business Administration develops students' leadership and management skills. The degree places emphasis on problem-solving and decision-making, leadership, cross-cultural communications and strategic thinking.

### Bachelor of Commerce

The Bachelor of Commerce offers significant flexibility and diversity for students. Students must complete an eight-course major from the following list: Accounting, Business Information Systems, Corporate Sustainability, Economic Studies, Finance, International Business, Management or Marketing.

### Bachelor of Economics

## Undergraduate program transfer requirements

- If transferring externally, then it will be assessed based on ATAR equivalent. So either 97 ATAR if they are applying with less than 1 year FTE of tertiary studies or the GPA equivalent of 1 FTE or more tertiary studies.
- As our LLB program is capped and early offers are confirmed, it is very unlikely that external transfers will receive an offer
- For internal ANU transfers, whereby they start at another program and transfer into LLB/FDD Law. We assess them on their final ATAR if they have less than one year FTE at ANU or if they have one year FTE or more, we have the approval to provide an offer if they achieve a 5.6 GPA.

You will be offered opportunities to gain practical experience during your degree through internships, clinical placements, and negotiation and mooted competitions.

The honours component of the program is embedded in the degree structure to improve your

career prospects and provide you with a strong foundation for future postgraduate study.

Overall, our ANU Bachelor of Laws (Honours) program provides the academic component to be a legal practitioner.
