

The St George's Anglican Grammar School uniform has been designed to develop a school identity and give students a sense of pride and belonging to the School. It is expected that students wear the uniform correctly when attending and travelling to and from school.

At sporting matches and practices or during Physical Education lessons and relevant co-curricular activities such as carnivals, full sports uniform or other prescribed dress must be worn.

PERSONAL GROOMING

There is a requirement that the dress and personal grooming of our students will reflect the high standards expected. This is of particular importance when students are seen in uniform in the wider community. Students are also expected to maintain the code of dress and grooming on the sports field, or as spectators as at all times, they are representatives of St George's.

GUIDELINES

- Winter uniform is worn in Terms 2 and 3. Summer uniform is worn in Terms 1 and 4.
- Blazers are to be worn to and from school in Terms 2 and 3. They are to be worn throughout the day but may be removed in class for comfort or activity. They are to be worn to Chapel on Mondays (Senior) and Thursdays (Junior) throughout the year.
- School jumper and blazer sleeves are not to be pulled up to the elbows and jumpers/blazers should not be tied around the waist.
- Undergarments are to be either white or skin tones and are not to have motifs or patterns that are clearly visible through the dress, white shirt or sports polo top.
- Shirt buttons must be done up when wearing the School tie, and only the top button should be left undone in the summer terms (Terms 1 and 4) when no tie is worn.
- Skirt and dress length should touch the top of the knee cap.
- All uniforms are to be kept clean, pressed and in good condition. Uniforms must be ironed and free from stains or marks.
- School bathers are optional for swimming lessons and Interhouse swimming but are **compulsory** for Interschool swimming events. Bathers used for all School swimming sessions should be modest in their nature and be one-piece. No two pieces are permitted.
- New school shirts purchased for the 2025 school year are designed to sit at hip level and do not need to be tucked in. Students choosing to wear the old shirt during the uniform transition period must have it tucked in at all times.
- From 2025 all students are to wear the same school tie, regardless of which shirt they choose to wear. The school bow tie is no longer available for purchase and is not to be worn.
- School shorts may be worn instead of long pants, if preferred, as a part of the Winter uniform.
- Sports Uniform and Academic Uniform are separate uniforms and are not to be worn together.
- Sports Uniform and/or Dance/Drama Uniform may be worn home at the end of the day if a student has sport/drama or dance in Periods 5/6, or to School at the beginning of the day if a student has sport/drama or dance in Periods 1/2.

UNIFORM PURCHASES

ACCESSORIES, HAIR, MAKE-UP

Belts:

Belts must be a plain black leather/leather type strap with a silver simple buckle.

Hair:

It is expected that students' hair styles are sensible and reflect the conservative and professional nature of the School. This applies to both cut and colour.

- Hair should be clean, brushed and of a natural colour.
- Hair must be kept off the face and fringes must be above the eyebrows.
- Ribbons must be in School colours ie. red, black or white.
- Hair must be tied back once it reaches the top of the collar.
- Cuts or styles which, in the opinion of the School, are extreme are not acceptable.
- Dreadlocks, coloured beading, "Bali-style" braiding (unless culturally appropriate), under-cut hairstyles, 'rats tails' and patterns or lines cut into the hair are examples of some prohibited hairstyles.
- Mullets are not permissible within the School.

The School will exercise discretion in determining whether or not a hairstyle is acceptable. If in doubt students should consult the School before making radical changes to their hair.

Students with extremes of hair colour and/or styles will be sent home to remedy the situation.

Hat / Cap:

The School hat or cap is compulsory when outdoors, except when walking to and from Chapel.

Jewellery:

- One standard wristwatch may be worn. Smartwatches may be worn in accordance with the Assessment Policy and the Mobile Phone and Computer Use Policy.
- One pair (or a single) of plain gold or silver round studs (no larger than 5mm) or sleepers (no larger than 10mm), may be worn in the ear lobe in the first hole only. Multiple earrings may not be worn. Diamond and/or pearl earrings are not permitted whilst at school.
- Visible other piercings are not permitted. This includes the tongue and the nose.
- Necklaces are not to be visible other than a simple small cross and chain.
- All other forms of jewellery which are not listed above are not permitted whilst in School Uniform except with permission from the Principal.

Makeup:

• No visible makeup should be worn. No false eyelashes or lash extensions are to be worn at any time.

Nails:

- No nail polish is permitted whilst at school.
- Fingernails should be of a natural colour, short, clean and a suitable length for school-based activities.
- No false nails are allowed.



Facial Hair:

Faces should be kept clean-shaven.

Well-groomed facial hair is permitted only with explicit permission from the Dean of Students & Wellbeing in Years 10 - 12.

Sunglasses:

Students may wear sunglasses outside of the classroom for eye protection and when travelling to and from school.

- Short sleeve School shirt with School crest
- Grey School shorts or grey School pants
- Black leather belt
- Grey striped School socks
- Plain black leather shoes, flat sole and low heel, full cover, in lace-up only
- Grey School hat with School crest or red cap with School crest
- Grey School backpack or trolley bag with School crest
- Red School jumper or vest with School crest (optional)
- Red School blazer (for Chapel)

Winter

- Short sleeve School shirt with School crest
- School tie
- Grey School pants or shorts
- Black leather belt
- Grey striped School socks
- Plain black leather shoes, flat sole and low heel, full cover, in lace-up only
- Grey School hat with School crest or red cap with School crest
- Grey School backpack or trolley bag with School crest
- Red School jumper or vest with School crest (optional)
- Red School blazer
- Grey School scarf with School crest (optional)

Uniform B:

Summer

- School dress with School crest
- White striped School socks
- Plain black leather shoes, flat sole and low heel, full cover, in lace-up only
- Grey School hat with School crest or red cap with School crest
- Grey School backpack or trolley bag with School crest
- Red School jumper or vest with School crest (optional)
- Red School blazer (for Chapel)

Winter

- Short sleeve School blouse with School crest
- Grey striped School skirt or grey School trousers.
- School tie
- Plain black leather shoes, flat sole and low heel, full cover, in lace-up only
- Grey School hat with School crest or red cap with School crest
- Grey backpack or trolley bag with School crest
- Red School jumper or cardigan with School crest
- Red School blazer
- Grey School scarf with School crest(optional)
- Black School stockings 50 denier (compulsory in winter when worn with the skirt)



Student Uniform and Grooming

Sports Uniform:

- School sports polo shirt with School crest
- School sports shorts
- School sports socks
- School sports tracksuit (optional)
- House polo shirt for Interhouse events
- School hat with School crest or red cap with School crest
- Appropriate, closed, supportive sport shoes/ runners /cross trainers with laces and predominantly white in colour.
- School sports bag

Dance Uniform:

- Plain black leotard, thick straps, high back, full coverage
- Plain black fitted t-shirt, full coverage
- Plain black leggings or stretchable pants, either ¾ or full length, full coverage
- Performing Arts Jacket (optional)
 - Contemporary foot thongs and jazz shoes are recommended for performances

Drama Uniform:

- Plain black t-short or longsleeve shirt (no logos or prints)
- Plain black leggings, track pants, or theatreappropriate pants (no shorts or skirts)
- Black closed in shoes (jazz shoes or sneakers preferred)
- Performing Arts Jacket (optional)

When formal uniform is required, it is the full winter uniform:

At official School functions or at functions designated by the Principal, students are to wear their formal uniform. The blazer is a compulsory component of the formal uniform and is expected to be worn to and from Chapel services each week.

School Shoes:

- Black full leather
- No Canvas shoes
- Full cover, lace up school design; and
- Flat sole and low heels no higher than 1.5 cms.

Sports Shoes:

Students are permitted to wear appropriate, closed, supportive sport shoes /runners /cross trainers with laces. However, these must be proper exercise shoes not canvas, gym boots, indoor soccer shoes or slip-on shoes. They should be predominantly white in colour.
