LITERACY

This term the children will continue to consolidate their letter sound knowledge and their understanding of blends and consonant digraphs by reading CVCC, CCVC & CCVCC words e.g. nest, drum, plant, shop, stick etc. They will learn about the long vowel sounds and some common vowel digraphs. They will continue to focus on some common suffixes e.g. -s, -ed, -ing and further develop their knowledge of punctuation when reading, to improve their fluency and phrasing.

The children will continue to be exposed to both fiction and non-fiction texts during our Shared Reading sessions, building on strategies good readers use to help them gain meaning and to understand what we are reading. They will practise different comprehension skills, such as sequencing, answering literal and inferential questions and finding key words.

The children will develop their writing skills by continuing to write recounts, as well as engaging in narrative writing. They will have opportunities to draft, edit and publish their writing, checking for punctuation e.g. full stops and capital letters. Handwriting will continue to be a focus, particularly the correct formation, sizing and placement of letters within the dotted thirds.

MATHS

In our Term Four **Data Unit**, students will collect, sort, and learn how to represent and describe data. They will begin to notice patterns and use simple language such as "most" and "least" when describing the data collected.

In our **Location Unit**, students will explore how to describe where things are using everyday words like *next* to, between, behind, and in front of. They will also give and follow simple directions through games and classroom activities.

In our **Counting and Place Value Unit,** students will continue to count forwards and backwards, recognise numbers in the teens and beyond, and match numbers to groups of objects. They will start to understand that the position of a number tells us its value (for example, 12 is one ten and two ones).

In our **Measurement Units**, students will explore how we measure time using days, weeks, and daily routines. We will talk about when events happen, and use calendars to track special days. Students will also compare and order objects by length (longer, shorter) and capacity (holds more, holds less). They will use informal units like blocks or cups to measure and make comparisons.







Term 4 Value: Optimism

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL)

During Term Four, the children will focus on our school value of **Optimism**. They will learn what it means to have a positive outlook, to keep trying even when things are tricky, and to look for the good in every situation. We will learn about growth mindset language, by modeling phrases like "I can't do this *yet*" or "Mistakes help us learn." The children will continue to develop their awareness of others and consider how their actions impact their classmates and peers. Students will continue building relationships across the prep classes in preparation for Grade One.

BIOLOGICAL SCIENCE

This term in our **Biological Science Unit**, the students will explore the amazing world of plants and animals. They will learn how living things can be grouped by their features and discover that all plants and animals need air, water, food, and shelter to survive. Students will observe how different features like wings, beaks and claws help living things adapt and survive. Our visit to the Melbourne Zoo and the observation of chickens hatching will help students understand adaptations and animal life cycles in meaningful and exciting ways.

RELIGION

In Term Four, students will learn about how we can care for **God's creation**. They will discover that our world is a special gift from God and that we all have a part to play in looking after it. Children will listen to Bible stories like *The Creation Story* and *The Parable of the Sower* to learn how we can care for the Earth. They will also listen to Indigenous Dreamtime stories that teach the importance of respecting and protecting nature.

HOME LEARNING

Home Reading Continues...

It is expected that all students read for a minimum of 10 mins per night, four times a week. Students are required to record their reading in their Log Books each night. Please ensure these Logbooks are kept in mailbags and brought to school, as they contain log in details children use at school. Please continue to ensure the focus remains on reading for enjoyment, as it is our priority to foster a love of reading!
