## **Good News Story**

## Marrung Lead in NEVR Schools

We are happy to announce Marrung Leads have recently been appointed across the region.

'Marrung' is Department of Education and Training's (DET) Aboriginal Education Plan to ensure that all Indigenous Victorians achieve their learning aspirations. The Marrung education plan is aimed at improving performance and success of Koorie students in Victoria and close the gap in their educational outcomes.

The introduction of the Marrung Lead commitment will assist greatly to support better Koorie student and family engagement and learning through strong advocacy for a whole of school approach utilising the Individual Education Plan (IEP) as the fundamental key platform to improve learning and engagement.

The key responsibilities of the Marrung Lead are:

- Support the school with understanding of Koorie student/family safety and the implementation of Marrung priorities
- Monitoring attendance of all Koorie students
- Regular engagement with Koorie Engagement Support Officer (KESO)
- Ensure all Koorie students have a high-quality Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- Ensure Student Support Groups (SSGs) meet regularly to review and update IEPs
- Ensure Koorie students and families participate fully and feel empowered in SSG meetings
- Support a culture of high expectations and aspirations for every Koorie student
- Provide (and broker) expert advice and support for staff in the effective inclusion of all Koorie students

Last week, a Meet and Greet, followed by a Professional Learning session with our Marrung Area Implementation Team and Koorie workforce was held and was positively attended by many schools within the region.



Link Health and Community is the Early Childhood Partner delivering the Early Childhood Approach for children under 7 in Outer East Melbourne, Inner East Melbourne, Southern Melbourne, Inner Gippsland and Outer Gippsland for the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS).

#### You can access the Early Childhood Approach if your child is under 7 years old and:

- You have concerns about your child's development; or
- Your child has a disability

We are here to support you to make informed choices about available services and supports to get the best outcomes for your child. We will tailor our support to your child's individual needs and circumstances.

#### Some of the ways we may assist you are:

- Understanding the goals you have for your child
- Connecting you with practical information to help you understand your child's developmental needs
- Connecting you and your child with services and supports in your local community
- We may provide you with a short period of early supports
- We will support you to apply to the NDIS, if you decide to apply on your child's behalf
- If your child becomes an NDIS participant, we will work with you to develop an NDIS plan.

## We are excited to announce Marrung Education Scholarships are now OPEN!!

Marrung Education Scholarships support Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students to complete years 11 and 12 in 2023 - 2024. There are 30 scholarships of \$5,000 each (\$2,500 per year over two years) available.

The scholarship recognise students who demonstrate a high potential to succeed in their chosen pathway.

### Who can apply?

Marrung education scholarships are for students who are:

- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- completing year 10 at a Victorian government school
- planning on completing year 11 and 12 at a Victorian government school.
