



Sounds/spelling rules:

- Review of sounds: s, m, t, a, p, i, f, r, o, c, d, h, e, n, g, l, k, u, b, j, qu, v, w, x, y, z
- Vowel sounds: a, e, i, o, u (sometimes y) - all the words that we read and write need at least one vowel sound written with our vowel letters
- Double letter digraphs: two letters that are the same, together make the one sound eg. bell, sniff, hiss, buzz.
- Digraph 'ck', two letters coming together to make one sound - we never see the 'ck' at the beginning of a word only at the end

Vocabulary:

Syllable: a beat in a word eg. ex/cell/ent

Vowels: a, e, i, o, u

Consonant: every letter in the alphabet that isn't a vowel sound eg. b,c,d,f,g,j,k,l,m

Phoneme: what sounds you can hear in a word

Digraph: 2 letters coming together to make one sound
