All persons aged < 20 years of age are eligible to catch up vaccines above, as well as IPV, VZV and MenC.

It is preferable to administer Men ACWY vaccines for Men C catch ups

Adult refugees and humanitarian entrants are eligible to catch up dTpa, Hepatitis B, IPV, MMR and VZV vaccines

6 months to <3 years	Influenza	FluQuadri Junior	Children aged 6 months to <9 years of age require 2 doses (1 month apart) in the first year they receive the vaccine.
3 years to <5 years	Influenza	Fluarix Tetra or FluQuadri	
≥ 5 years to 17 years Aboriginal and/or medically at risk	Influenza	Fluarix Tetra or FluQuadri	
≥ 18 years Aboriginal and/or medically at risk	Influenza	Afluria Quad, Fluarix Tetra, FluQuadri	Afluria Quad must only be administered to people aged ≥ 18 years and older
≥ 65 years	Influenza	Fluad or Fluzone High-Dose	
Pregnant Women	Influenza	Fluarix Tetra, FluQuadri, Afluria Quad*	During each pregnancy, any trimester
WA Health Staff	Influenza	Fluarix Tetra, FluQuadri	≥ 65 years Fluad or Fluzone High-Dose
