Important Information

- All Year 10 and Unit 2 VCE classes are cancelled during the exam period. VCE-VM classes continue as normal. VCE-VM students do not sit exams.
- Exams will take place in Studio 13&14. Students with special provisions will be placed into Tech Lab 1&2.
- During the exam period, students may dress in casual clothes.
- Students must be prompt and attend their exams 10 minutes before the exam scheduled time. This means moving to your exam before you hear the music indicating the end of recess and lunch.
- You are only required to be at school for your exams. For bus travellers and students who need to stay at school, you must sign in at the office. If you are at school but not in an exam, you must stay in this study space, Collab 1, at all times. You must use your time to study quietly.
- Please ensure you are familiar with the required materials for each exam (e.g. calculators) and bring these materials on the day of your exam. If you are unsure of the materials you are permitted, please ask your teacher.
- All stationary items must be in a clear pencil case or ziplock bag. Only clear drink bottles are permitted in the exam room.
- Please speak to Sarah Baglin ASAP to reschedule exams, especially if you have three exams in one day.

Exam Expectations

Students:

- must not communicate with any other student during the exam.

- must not cause any nuisance, annoyance or interference to any other student during the exam. Students will receive two warnings of inappropriate behaviour. A further breach of behaviour expectations will result in the student being removed from the exam.
- must not begin to write or mark their paper or response material in any way, or use a calculator, until advised by a supervisor that writing may commence.
- must raise their hand if they wish to communicate with a supervisor.
- must not leave their seat until permitted by a supervisor.
- will not be permitted to leave the exam until the end of the allocated time.
- must cease writing when instructed to do so by a supervisor.
- must remain silent and seated in their place at the end of the exam, until response materials have been collected and checked, and an announcement is made permitting students to leave the examination room.
- must not remove any response material, used or unused, from the examination room.
- must not possess mobile phones and electronic devices that are capable of storing, receiving or transmitting information or electronic signals, such as recorded music and video players, organisers, dictionaries and smart watches, during exams. If they have any of these devices, we ask they hand them to an exam supervisor immediately, before the exam commences. They will be returned at the end of the exam.
- ensure the exam they have sitting in front of them is for the correct subject.
- ensure that they have all the materials needed as indicated by their teacher and written on the front of the exam.

Exam supervisors:

- commence the exam when you have read the expectations above to the students and they have the correct exam and required materials.
- instruct the students on when reading time ends and writing time commences.
- mark time off the board for students in 10-minute increments.
- respond to student enquiries when they raise their hand.
- correct any unacceptable behaviour; for students requiring more than two corrections of behaviour, please contact leadership to remove the student from the exam.
- give students a 5-minute warning before the end of their exam.
