There are 500+ job options out there through Australian apprenticeships, across 30+ different industries. Here's the lowdown:-

Apprenticeships:

- Finishing an apprenticeship is required for skilled trades like electrical, plumbing, carpentry, cabinetmaking, automotive, hairdressing, engineering fabrication, fire systems technician and more
- It usually takes up to 4 years
- Gives you a nationally recognised qualification
- Is highly respected overseas, too

Traineeships:

- A traineeship is common in areas like office admin, IT, tourism, hospitality, beauty therapy and more
- Takes around 1–3 years
- Also gives you a nationally recognised qualification and internationally accepted

Labour Force Data - November 2025

In seasonally adjusted terms, in November 2025:

- unemployment rate remained at 4.3%.
- participation rate decreased to 66.7%.
- employment decreased to 14,655,700.
- employment to population ratio decreased to 63.8%.
- underemployment rate increased to 6.2%.
- monthly hours worked decreased to 1,996 million.
- full-time employment decreased by 56,500 to 10,076,800 people.
- part-time employment increased by 35,200 to 4,578,900 people.

Rare Earth industry jobs

Jobs in Australia's rare minerals sector are super varied from hands-on site work to engineering, geology and office roles. Big players like Lynas, Iluka and Northern Minerals, plus newer projects with Hastings Technology Metals are often hiring especially around new refineries like Eneabba. You'll usually find roles on job sites or company careers pages, with opportunities across construction, processing and technical jobs. Some of the key Companies & Projects Hiring:

- [Lynas Rare Earths](#): Major producer with operations in WA, seeking lab analysts, engineers.
- [Iluka Resources](#): Operates in mineral sands, with opportunities for technicians (e.g., Jacinth-Ambrosia).
- [Northern Minerals](#): Developing the Browns Range Heavy Rare Earths Project, offering roles in sustainable sourcing.

- [Hastings Technology Metals](#): Developing the Yangibana Project, hiring for roles in exploration and development.
- [Civmec](#): Building the Eneabba Rare Earths Refinery, seeking construction trades like carpenters, welders, concrete finishers.

Resilience of cultural and creative workforce

New research from the Bureau of Communications, Arts and Regional Research (BCARR) has taken a deep dive into Australia's cultural and creative jobs and for the first time, it shows just how strong and resilient this sector has been over the past decade. It looks at cultural and creative employment from 2008–09 to 2023–24 and lines up with the goals of Australia's National Cultural Policy — *Revive*. Here's what's new:

- Phase 1 looked at how much money cultural and creative industries contribute to the economy
- Phase 2 (this report) zooms in on the people doing the work — aka the workforce behind the creativity
- The jobs counted in this research match the creative activities studied earlier, giving governments and industries solid info to plan future jobs, training and funding.

Why it matters - understanding who works in creative industries helps shape better policies around long-term careers, fairness, growth and support so creative talent doesn't get overlooked.

Some key findings:

- Around 591,302 people worked in a cultural or creative job in 2023–24 — that's a 7.1% increase from the year before
- The sector makes up 4.1% of all jobs in Australia, which is similar in size to industries like transport and wholesale trade
- The biggest areas for creative jobs were architecture services, advertising and promotion and visual arts and crafts

They've spotted 37 fast-growing new jobs, grouped into four big areas:

- Net zero (clean energy and sustainability)
- Science & engineering (including bio, chem and engineering roles)

Seventeen Australian companies across eight different industries have made it onto Forbes' 2025 World's Best Employers list. (out of 900 organisations worldwide).

Key takeaways:

- Atlassian was Australia's top-ranked company, coming in at #117, thanks to its collaborative and flexible work culture
- Last year's Aussie number one, BHP Group, followed super closely at #118
- Banking and financial services dominated the list, with 6 of the 17 companies, including the Big Four Banks:
 - ANZ (#181)
 - Commonwealth Bank (#269)
 - Westpac (#278)
 - NAB (#418)
- Woolworths, Australia's biggest private employer with around 190,000 staff, ranked #819
- Qantas, the national carrier, came in at #872

Anthony Mundine's MGM making a difference in work and life

In 2026, Anthony Mundine will hit 10 years of opening doors and creating real opportunities for his community. His business, Mundine Gosh Management (MGM) Australia, which he started with his lifelong mate Gosh Daher, focuses on creating clear job pathways for First Nations people in the construction industry. One of those success stories is Chris Phillips. He says work used to feel pretty unstable, but now he's thriving with the right people backing him. Now 26, Chris works as a traffic controller on a big project at Stockland's Figtree Hill housing estate in Sydney's south-west.

Growing up, work was never really steady for Chris. Finding a decent company was tough but things have changed. After two years with MGM, he says it's been challenging in a good way and has helped him build something solid. QTAC & Tertiary Entry



So, how does QTAC work?

In Queensland, most uni and TAFE courses are applied for through QTAC. QTAC works out your ATAR and handles applications for QLD unis, some interstate unis, TAFE Queensland and some private colleges.

What you need to know:

- The 2027 QTAC Guide goes online in July (no printed copies)
- It covers how applications and offers work, plus 1,600+ courses
- Applications open early August and usually close December (a few close earlier so watch out!)
- You can list up to 6 course preferences, but you'll only get one offer
- Offers are released November–February
- You can change preferences (for most courses) within QTAC deadlines

Some courses or providers aren't through QTAC — those are applied for directly. For interstate study, you usually apply through that state's admissions centre (except Tasmania, where you apply straight to UTAS).
