

Bicycle Network's Ride2School program has been supporting schools across Australia to be more active for almost two decades, but now the program is under threat. The Victorian Government has funded the Ride2School program since its outset 17 years ago, but this agreement has come to an end and Ride2School's future looks uncertain beyond it.

Australian kids are among the least active in the world – research from the World Health Organization recently ranked them 140 out of 146 globally for physical activity. Ride2School helps to combat this by encouraging kids to be active on their journey to and from school.

We are exploring all avenues when it comes to alternative funding and are optimistic about the possibilities. While we work to secure Ride2School's future, we are reaching out to the community for donations.
