

What is work experience?

Work experience is a learning, not an earning experience. Sometimes called work shadowing or workplace learning, it's a chance to get a feel for day-to-day working life in a particular job.

At the end of your placement, you may decide that this career is the right one for you, you could rule it out, or you might even discover an alternative which suits you even more.

WHEN CAN YOU DO WORK EXPERIENCE?

Many students do work experience while they're at high school, and while some schools run formal work experience programs, it's possible to seek out work experience independently during school holidays too.

You can also do work experience once you've finished school, but the rules may be different.

HOW LONG WILL MY PLACEMENT BE?

Formal work experience programs tend to run in 5-day blocks, shadowing a typical employee on a normal work week. This could mean shifts, travel between work sites, or rotating through a number of departments to increase your exposure to possible jobs.

CAN I DO MORE THAN ONE WORK EXPERIENCE PLACEMENT?

Work experience can be undertaken more than once - so if you finish your placement and rule out one job, then there's nothing stopping your from seeking out work experience for your 'Plan B' job role.

If it's proving tricky to find in-person work experience, virtual work experience programs may be an available alternative for many industries.

Why undertake work experience?


Work experience could help you figure out if you're on the right track when it comes to your career plans.

Without the chance to try out what it's like to work a day (or week) in your intended job, you are might feel like you are guessing that it's the right job for you, and instead of making decisions based on information, you might be choosing based on:

- what others have told you
- what you've read
- what you've seen on TV
- what you hope it will be like

This guide will cover how to find (and apply for) work experience and includes insights into how to make the most of it.

Work experience also looks great on your resume, and in a tight job market, it could make you a more competitive applicant, increasing your chance of getting an interview.



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Work experience vs structured workplace learning

Schools and course providers tend to offer two kinds of work placements: work experience and Structured Workplace Learning (SWL). Though they can be similar, they serve different purposes.

This guide covers general work experience, so if you need to complete formal SWL as part of your course, you'll need to check with your teachers for any specific requirements.

Usually, your school or course provider will help you find SWL if you need it for your course.

WORK EXPERIENCE...

- isn't always a curriculum requirement
- can be in any area of interest
- is mainly observational
- is usually for students in years 9, 10, or 11
- may have a maximum number of days per year

STRUCTURED WORKPLACE LEARNING...

- can be a requirement as part of some vocational and trade courses
- must be in a specific course area
- has a minimum hours requirement
- counts as part of assessment and course completion
- is usually done by senior students

The benefits of work experience

"Isn't work experience just fetching coffee and free labour?"

Of course not!

Work experience is designed to help you. In fact, employers often go out of their way to give you as much exposure to their jobs as possible. It can be invaluable, and if given the chance, you should make every effort to learn more about your future options while you're there.

It can help you to:

- align your school studies with possible careers
- build important skills for both life and work
- speak with people in the job about the pathways they took
- explore an industry in-depth
- see if your 'dream job' is actually what you thought it might be
- learn about careers you didn't know existed

You could save years of your life by not studying for a career you won't love, and instead be working on something you'll enjoy.

Needless to say, it's much better to find that out now rather than in three to five years' time after you've finished a degree.



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Choose wisely and make it meaningful

Work experience placements can sometimes be tricky to come by, so if you do find one, definitely make the most of it.

Don't go after the brightest, shiniest work experience possible - if you can't see yourself working in that field later then give it a miss.

In other words, unless you're planning on being a zoologist or a vet, don't apply to the zoo. Or if you're thinking of being an entertainer, leave the council admin job for someone else.

Your time is valuable (and so is the employer's), so it's a good idea to look around before deciding on where you want to spend your time. And if you can't find something that's perfect, that's OK.

Any work experience is better than none at all. Being in a work environment can be valuable, so don't reject the opportunity if you can't get what you really want. Just approach it with an open mind and see what happens.

What to expect on your placement

Your placement is about more than just learning about a particular job - it's about building your skills and confidence, experiencing the world of work, and starting to make connections and decisions for your future.

The best way to get the most out of any placement is to actively participate in team activities and engage in conversations. This is your chance to seek knowledge in an environment outside of school - and it might be one you find yourself thriving in.

YOU CAN...

- Observe employees at work
- Perform simple tasks under supervision
- Ask lots and lots of questions
- Take notes and keep examples of any work you do
- Ask for a reference at the end of your placement

YOU CAN'T...

- Be paid for your time
- Work unsupervised
- Operate any machinery that requires a license (if unlicensed)
- Work in gambling or serve alcohol (if you are underage)
- Work in a dangerous environment
- Give medicine to or bathe patients

Work experience can be undertaken in nearly any industry you can think of, but you might not be able to have a go at all the jobs within that industry due to health and safety, training, security, or other regulations.

If there's a job you're interested in but it's unsuitable for work experience, there might be some alternatives. For example, you could work in the office or administrative department instead of working out in the field.

How to find work experience

Finding work experience can be tricky. Nearly every business or organisation is a possibility - you can approach anyone you like and ask them if they're willing to take you on.

But keep in mind many businesses are under pressure and may not have the capacity to take you on, even if it's just for a week. And some workplaces might not be appropriate for a young person to be exposed to.

That being said, many employers are keen to help others get a start in their field, and will be happy to take on keen students. If they can't fit you in for a week, you could ask to visit for an afternoon, or even just ask to have a conversation with them about their job or industry. You could even ask to send them an email with questions you have that they can answer when they're available.



Your responsibilities

If you successfully apply for a placement, your employer should let you know the details of the job, such as start and end times, the name of the person to speak to when you arrive, what kind of duties you might be doing, etc.

Aside from the finer details, here are some tips about your daily responsibilities:

GETTING THERE

You will be expected to make your own way to and from your placement.

If your parents usually take you to school in the morning, they can probably organise to drop you off in the morning and pick you up again in the afternoon. You can also take public transport if it's available, like a train, bus, or ride share.

BEING PROFESSIONAL

Remember to maintain a professional demeanour throughout your work experience. This includes things like being polite and respectful to colleagues, showing up on time, and a having positive attitude.

These habits will demonstrate your enthusiasm and leave a lasting impression (and could net you a positive reference at the end of your placement).

WHAT TO WEAR

What you wear to your placement will depend on the kind of work you are doing. Most of the time you will be expected to dress similarly to a regular employee.

In some cases you might have to wear a uniform - this will most likely be supplied to you as part of the agreement. Your employer must provide you with Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) if necessary.

If you're not sure what to wear, ask either your careers advisor or the employer.

WHAT TO BRING

It's a good idea to bring a notebook and pen to write down any observations or things you learn.

You might also like to bring something for lunch and a bottle of water.

Your rights

As a work experience student, you're still entitled to many of the rights of regular employees - but there are some extra things that you should keep in mind too.

IMPORTANT OR PRODUCTIVE WORK

While you can certainly engage in some tasks and activities during your placement, you are not there to provide free labour to the employer - so if you're being given work that they would normally have to pay someone to do, then speak up.

For example, at a bakery you can watch someone making bread and then have a go yourself, but you shouldn't be left to bake all the bread for the day.

WORKPLACE SAFETY

Your employer is responsible for your safety and welfare during your placement. This includes physical safety (e.g. working with tools or at heights) and mental/emotional safety (e.g. bullying and harassment in the workplace).

If asked to do something you don't feel is reasonable or have any concerns, let your school, the employer, and parents know straight away.

BREAKS

Even as a work experience student, you are still entitled to the same number of breaks as other workers. As a general rule of thumb, if you work for more than five hours, you are entitled to at least one break.

The length and number of breaks can differ depending on the industry - your employer will let you know what they are, and if you forget you can always ask.


