Thank-you **Lily** and Good afternoon everyone. A very warm welcome to all our guests, our families, friends and so great to see a many of our past colleagues... It is also a delight to have a number of our wonderful Alumni join us today..... our amazing classes of 2023 and 2024 and lovely to hear the recollections of Lua as well as tributes from Lily and Valentino and from our Foundation School Council President Steve Pearce....as you aptly said Val, someone we will always remain indebted to.

I feel very humbled to have the opportunity this afternoon to say a few words about the incredible leader, educator and person that is Ms Debby Chaves. We are all so blessed to have known you and to have benefited from your vision and passion.

So Seven and ½ years ago I walked into Beaumaris North Primary School into the rather small room that you see on the screen...and please forgive me Sherril Duffy as you were such wonderful hosts during that term...and so pleased that you have joined us today... and I might note that we did soon after my arrival move out to a more expansive accommodations at Beaumaris Nth. So, I took this somewhat poor resolution photo with my Blackberry phone... and I consider this the first photograph of Beaumaris Secondary College
