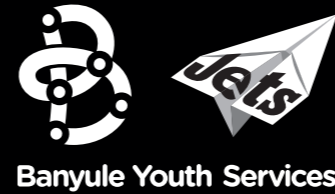


Supported Referrals

YouthFest

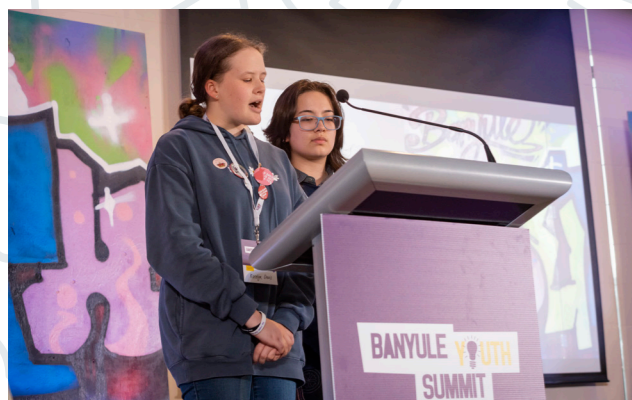

workers/professionals, supporting them to have the skills to hold difficult and courageous conversations until they can find support.
