Liturgical JottingsKerygma

Generally speaking Kerygma is the proclamation of the good news of Jesus. Kerygma is the content and the activity and the task of the preacher. Writers express this concept in various ways: The Proclaimer, Jesus Christ, became the Proclaimed (R Bultmann), or the public proclamation Christianity to the non-Christian world (C H Dodd) but also includes the teaching and training of the and believers. disciples all Kerygma is linked to the literary form of the Gospels. Mark presents Christ's words and works with mystery of the cross and the call to be disciples. Matthew by five great discourses revealing Christ's mess-age for the community. Luke uses the journey motif to explain Jesus' death and resurrection and John by revealing Christ's glory by the seven signs and the events of crucifixion and resurrection.

Today's readings highlight the role of kerygma: to proclaim and preach salvation for all.

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Looking at the Readings

The three readings and the psalm all mention foreigners and pagans and the call from God to them and the mission of the church towards them. The Gospel of Matthew was written for a church community comprised of Jewish converts to Christianity. The Gospel included many old testament references with which they would be familiar. But the Gospel particularly emphasises Jesus contacts with the gentiles (non-Jews). First three women are named in the family tree of Jesus, Tamar and Rahab Canaanites, and Ruth a Moabite (Matt 1:3,5). Matthew was they only Gospel to relate the wise men from the East coming to worship the Infant Jesus. A Roman Centurion asks Jesus to cure his servant (Matt 8:5-13) and the Canaanite (Syro-Phoenician) woman her daughter in today's Gospel. Jesus' initial response creates some speculation: Is he harsh or reluctant or discriminant or even humorous? He is also prophetic, like Isaiah, and educative to his listeners. He acknowledges the woman's deep and persistent faith and is compassionate to her and her daughter.

St Paul reveals his passion in his ministry and energy in his language and is definite in his arguments: for he brings the good news of salvation to the pagans. The Good News is the mercy and love of God for all.

REFLECTION FROM FR PETER

Today's gospel is about crossing boundaries into new territories that is not just geographical but also a venture into differences of culture, and religion. Jesus finds himself in 'pagan' territory, is confronted by a Canaanite woman, a descendant of one of the ancient enemies of Israel. She is revealed as a mother whose own daughter is in dire need of help. No husband or father is mentioned. We gather from this she is devoted to her daughter, and at the end of her tether.

Jesus' response to her is one of silence. Maybe Jesus is coming to terms with his own identity, crossing his own border, yet acknowledges the woman and her faith. For all the differences revealed in this story, Jesus' reveals his humanity, suggesting his own mission is expanded by the presence of the Canaanite woman. This might reveal something of today's meaning of people and their community... Are they part of us? If not, why then associate with them?

Being people of faith and life one of the great understandings this gospel brings is a mindset to being inclusive. Our Church is one where we keep hearing of the call to reach out. It's like Paul striving to resolve the differences between Jews and Gentiles in his community. Both groups have a history of disobedience, yet it God's greater mercy being there for all.

This might call us to see... What groups find themselves being excluded from Church life? or how might we at St Mel's live the radical hospitality of God's love in our time?
