ITEMS STUDENTS NEED TO BRING

- Sleeping bag, fitted single sheet, & pillow (students should be able to make bed themselves)

PLEASE NOTE: Due to COVID regulations, all students MUST bring a fitted single sheet to cover their mattress.

- Insect repellent
- Torch (for night walk)
- Garbage bag for dirty clothes
- Pens and pencils in a pencil case
- Sunscreen
- Optional** –Camera (disposable cameras are a great idea!), card games, colouring books, book to read etc.

NOTE: These items will be the student's own responsibility

- Backpack or small bag to carry each day
- Water bottle (No glass)

CLOTHING LIST – The following is a suggested list of clothing

- Walking shoes/runners
- Water shoes or an old pair of shoes to wear in the water (Not crocs or thongs)
- Underwear – 1 set for each day and 1 spare set
- Pyjamas
- Dressing gown or tracksuit
- Jumper/windcheater **only for canoeing** – may get wet
- 2 extra** jumpers or windcheaters
- Jeans/tracksuits/shorts
- T-Shirts/long sleeve tops
- Spare socks
- Bathers
- Beach towel
- Bath towel
- Waterproof coat
- Warm Coat/jacket
- Hat
- Thongs
- Toiletries – (soap, toothbrush & toothpaste, hairbrush, face washer)
- Deodorant (roll on or stick please – **NO aerosol spray cans**)
