





SENIOR STATUS INFORMATION AND PERMISSION SLIP

Permission for leaving the campus

Year 11/12 students with Senior Status are able to leave the campus during recess and lunch, and at other times as sanctioned by the Principal. It is expected that they return to the School promptly to be punctual for their next class.

When leaving the School campus students *must* sign out and in at Ground Floor Reception. This is for safety and security reasons. If a student does not comply with this requirement they may lose their Senior Status privilees.

It is an expectation that Year 11/12 students with Senior Status uphold the ethos and values of the School at all times when out in public. This includes:

- . Being respectful and considerate towards other members of the public.
- Wearing their uniform correctly and upholding the behaviour standards of the School whilst out in the city.

It is an expectation that Year 11/12 students with Senior Status adhere to the following risk management strategies:

- Sign in and out.
- Always remain in pairs. Never leave premises or travel independently.
- No use of public toilets.
- Have a mobile phone that is charged and has the School phone number as a contact.
- . Only cross roads at pedestrian crossings and obey traffic signals.
- Be wary and do not interact with members of the public acting suspiciously.
- Only travel in public thoroughfares not down isolated alleyways.
- If a student feels threatened or unsafe they should enter the nearest business/shop, request help and contact the School immediately. Remain there until help arrives.
- Remain within the following boundaries and do not cross these roads:
- St Georges Terrace, Barrack Street, Wellington Street, Milligan Street.
