

What a fantastic semester we've had in 2A!

As we approach the end of the year, it has been wonderful to look back and celebrate the incredible growth and progress each student has made. In English, we explored "Raindrop Plop" and "That's Not My Teddy". During reading sessions, students practised choosing books that interest them and engaging with them by turning pages independently. It has been especially exciting to visit the school library and take part in a variety of engaging activities. In Phonics, students have transitioned smoothly into their new literacy groups and have shown great adaptability during this change. In Mathematics, 2A students have been counting beyond 10, grouping and ordering objects, measuring length, and learning all about money. One of the class favourites has been our shopping role-play lessons, where students practised buying items and identifying different coins and notes, a skill they all did brilliantly.

Our Integrated Studies unit focused on Toys and Games, which the students absolutely loved. Chasing games such as "Duck Duck Goose" and "What's the Time, Mr Wolf?" gave everyone the chance to learn new rules, practise teamwork, and enjoy fun moments with classmates.

During Personal and Social Learning, we learned about our bodies and how to stay safe. Students have become very confident in recognising unsafe situations and suggesting ways to make them safer so that everyone can enjoy playtime with friends.

One of the highlights of each day is Choice Time, where students choose activities that interest them. Lego building and bubble time are definite favourites, in which students have loved creating imaginative structures and enthusiastically counting along as they pop bubbles.

Semester 2 has been busy, joyful, and filled with curiosity, learning, and growth. We are incredibly proud of everything the students have achieved this year, and we are grateful for the support from our wonderful community. Yasho and I have truly enjoyed working with 2A and cannot wait to see what they accomplish next.
