By completing Tackers 1 participants achieve the following with instructor's assistance:

Boat Handling

Steered with tiller extension under towing paddling power

The ability to tie a figure 8 knot, round twice and two half hitches

Learnt and practised how to perform the tack / "push turn"

Learnt and demonstrated how to gybe / "pull turn"

Comfortable reached around a figure of 8 course using both tacking and gybing

Sailing with the tiller extension (The Microphone Technique)

Learnt to sail upwind and downwind by following the rescue boat

Rules & Safety

Swim 50 metres in a PFD (vest)

Participated in a capsize

Participated in rescue drills

Realised the most important rule: Always avoid collisions!

Understanding of Port / Starboard right of way

Sailing Theory & Background

Identified the "no go zone" and the effects it has on your sailing

A background in safety knowledge of tides and currents

Basic wind awareness – wind direction and strength

Demonstrated respect and care of boat
