ENGLISH

Reading and Viewing

- Infer the author's intent

MATHEMATICS

Addition and Subtraction

- Identify and explain the relationship between addition and subtraction
- Develop efficient mental and written strategies for solving addition and subtraction problems

Measurement

- Measure, order and compare length, perimeter and area
- Recognise and use millimetres, centimetres and squared centimetres
- Find the area of rectangles

Time

- Tell the time to the minute
- Investigate the relationship between units of time

Angles

- Identify angles as measures of turn
- Compare angle sizes in everyday situations
- Recognise that analogue clocks use angles of the arms to indicate time, and compare the size of angles between the arms for familiar times
