READING

WRITING

MATHEMATICS

To begin this term the students will be reading about Explorers and the First Fleet. We be learning to skim and scan a text to locate information and answer questions about what we are reading.

We will then be learning about prefixes, suffixes and homophones.

Later in the term the students will participate in Reader's Theater tasks to develop their fluency and intonation when reading aloud. The students will begin Term 3 by revisiting Recount Writing by writing a recount about their holidays and then planning and writing their Smart Goals for Term 3.

Recount writing continues as students look into the past to learn about key figures from Australian history. They will then learn how to write Historical recounts about these figures.

Following recount writing students will learn to write biographies.

Throughout Term Three there will be a focus on using paragraphs correctly in all writing as well as editing (using an editing checklist).

Students will start the term learning about Fractions and Decimals. The children will revise and represent fractions such as $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{8}$, $\frac{1}{3}$ and $\frac{1}{8}$. The connection with decimals will be explored through tenths and hundredths.

During the second half of the term we will be exploring the Measurement and Geometry strand, as well as learning all about Angles.

Our final unit for the term is Location. During this unit the students will learn how to read a grid and key to locate places and objects on a map and create their own simple maps of familiar environments.

INTEGRATED INQUIRY

Our key concept across the school in Term 3 is **Belonging**. The essential question our students will be investigating is 'Where do YOU belong?'. This will be taught through the History curriculum looking at how and why life changed in the past, whilst identifying aspects of the past that have remained the same. Students will investigate the history, diversity and longevity of Australia's first peoples, whilst also exploring stories of the First Fleet, including causes and reasons for the journey, who travelled to Australia, and their experiences and perspectives following arrival.

SEL

Our whole school value for Term 3 is **Empathy**. Students will be learning to build an awareness and understanding of the emotions of others.

We will also explore problem solving, conflict
 resolution, resilience, calming strategies to use when emotionally heightened and
 gratitude.

RELIGION

To begin the term, students will complete a focus on Parables, where they will reflect on the meanings of these in their own lives.

They will then reflect on their sense of belonging to our parish and school community and identify ways that they can contribute to their growth and development.

Students will learn about the contribution of key figures in the Church's history, such as Mary MacKillop, Mother Teresa and Pope Francis.

Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

Towards the end of term, we will explore the different parts of the Mass and the significance of Eucharist in remembering Jesus.
