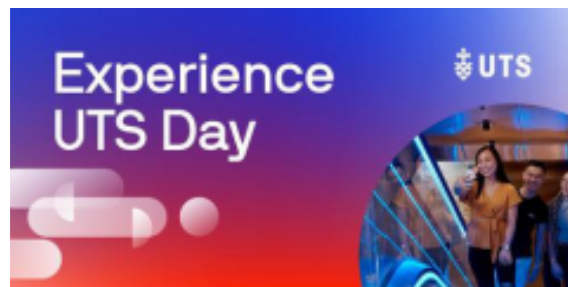

The UK is one of the world's most popular destinations for international students. As of academic year 2020/1, more than 600,000 international students had enrolled to study in the UK. Of these, more than 150,000 are from the EU.

You have a choice of more than 140 universities and other higher education institutions. Each offers a range of qualifications recognised around the world.

Tuition fees vary between institutions. Since Brexit, most EU and EEA nationals are no longer eligible for home fee status unless they're from Ireland or are already living in the UK and registered under the EU Settlement Scheme.

You'll need to be aware of visa conditions, English language requirements, and work permit restrictions. Find out more on the UK Government website.

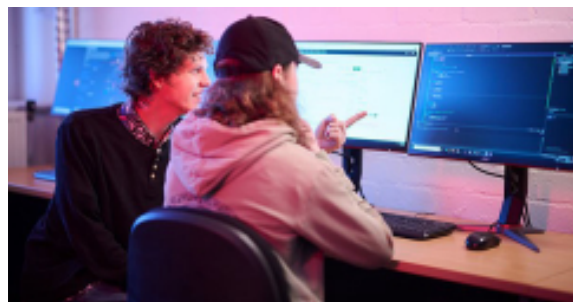

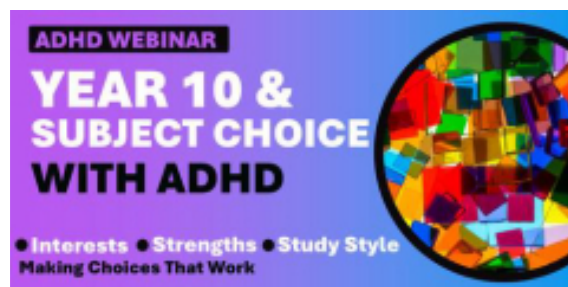

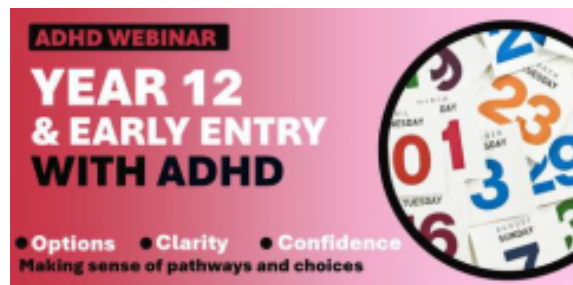
