NEW MISSIONARY SAINT FOR SALESIAN SISTERS

Today, Mission Sunday, in Rome, Pope Leo will declare "saint" Sr Maria Troncatti, an intrepid missionary in Equador, South America. Sr Maria was a mother to all: the Shuar people of the jungle, the settlers, the children. Everyone called her "madrecita", little mother. In 1969, when tensions escalated between settlers and the Shuar people in Sucua and the Salesians' mission and Shuar Federation building were burnt down, she offered her life to God as a victim so that peace might be restored. Soon after she died in a light plane crash near Sucua. At her funeral a beautiful rainbow appeared in the sky. And peace between the two peoples was restored. 
