Lysterfield Primary School is excited and looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Lysterfield Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2025.

We want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum. Having said that, your financial support enables us to bridge the funding gap to maintain the facilities, resources and programs we currently provide. Parent/carer contributions along with fundraising and volunteering around the school make a huge difference to our community, and we are truly thankful for your support.

Your support in 2024 allowed us to:

- Provide high quality teaching programs and subject specific materials (English, Maths, Science, Art, Music, Languages and Physical Education)
- Continued resourcing of a phonics-based reading program (Little Learners Love Literacy)
- Maintain sufficient sets of phonics-based books for students to develop reading skills
- Introduce new programs such as Sparkle and the continuation of Maths Masters
- Access online assessment tools to ensure effective teaching
- Provide quality wellbeing programs including Counselling, Lego Club, Calm Kids, Social Stencil, Circles, Friendology, RRRR and Breakfast Club
- Maintain and develop school grounds including rejuvenation of mulch under all playground areas
- Replacement of the soccer pitch which will occur over the summer break
- Resourceful and well-maintained library
- Ensure the upkeep and provision of computer devices, providing over 60 new laptops for student learning

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## Extra-Curricular Items and Activities – Pay as you go (PAYG)

Lysterfield Primary School offers a range of optional items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides to deliver the Curriculum. Parents and Guardians will be invited to access these activities and items on a pay as you go (PAYG) basis throughout the 2025 school year.

Families will be notified of camp costs next year, with the following camps scheduled in 2025:

### **Financial Support for Families**

Lysterfield Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

• Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps, and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parents, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school for use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, and sporting activities for the benefit of your child. CSEF cannot be used for Curriculum Contributions, Graduation or Other Contributions. The annual CSEF per student will be \$150.00 for primary school students. Applications will be made available via our newsletter and website.

- State Schools Relief (SSR) Foundation students eligible for CSEF will receive a uniform package mid-year via State Schools relief. New uniform and shoes may be available for families experiencing hardship, please speak to the Business Manager or Principal.
- Second-hand School Uniform
   Good condition second-hand uniform may be donated to our school to support our families. The Parent
  Association volunteers will sell good quality second-hand uniform at the beginning of each term dates
  and times will be published in our newsletters.
- Other financial support options for families Lysterfield Primary School has established partnerships with welfare and support agencies to assist our families.

# FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

## PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

#### **Curriculum Contributions**

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

#### Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

#### Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



# FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



# SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
