## **IMPLEMENTATION**

- 1. Actively maintain our identity as a Government secular school in line with Government Policy.
- 2. Actively promote respect for our community, and its varying cultures and traditions.
- 3. Value and build upon students' previous knowledge and experience.
- 4. Adopt classroom teaching strategies that cater for difference and use a range of learning styles.
- 5. Be alert and respond to any behaviour which exhibits prejudice or racism.
- 6. Review strategies for communicating with, and involving parents/carers, to take account of cultural issues.
- 7. Provide staff with opportunities to participate in professional development relating to cultural diversity and discrimination.
- 8. Celebrate cultural events
- 9. Create a welcoming environment for indigenous culture and promote reconciliation
