Favourite Teachers: "Mrs Marshall (former Debating Coordinator) had the biggest impact/influence on me as I did debating through years 7-12 and that really planted the seed for my public speaking/presenting skills. Ms Burns, my Year 12 English teacher, really believed in my ability to put my voice on paper and I think that's been huge because I now have a bestselling book called 'How to Endo'."

Favourite Memories: "Obviously the iconic chicken nugget rolls from the canteen! As well as debating competitions, particularly winning South Street and the state title in Year 9. School productions in Year 7 and 8. I also loved rowing and playing girls footy!"

What did you do after Year 12? "At the completion of Year 12 I deferred my Health Sciences course and worked in retail. I decided not to pursue Health Sciences and instead completed a Diploma of Visual Merchandising before having my first crack at music presenting through the Channel V Presenter Search. I ended up coming second out of 6000 applicants and realised that was the career I wanted to pursue. After a number of years volunteering as a music writer and community radio broadcaster, I scored a job at triple j. I've also been lucky to do a bunch of traveling since high school and even worked as a travel agent at one point!"

What are you doing now? "I'm a Melbourne-based radio presenter for national youth broadcaster triple j and host of their flagship new music program, Good Nights. Outside of broadcasting I'm a passionate advocate for endometriosis and author of the bestselling book 'How to Endo'. After being diagnosed with endometriosis in 2018 and following the outpouring of support I received for going public with my story, I launched the Instagram account @endogram, which aims to educate and start conversations about endometriosis with its 38,000-plus followers."
