What are we learning in Term Four?

English **Mathematics** Inquiry In Term 2, the Year Two students will This term, Year Two students will participate in

participate in completing rich Literacy tasks. In Reading and Viewing, the students will synthesise and analyse texts to create a deeper understanding. They will also build upon their ability to use text features to infer meaning.

In Writing the students will create a wide range of narratives and poems with a focus on the structure and using nouns appropriately to represent people, places and things.

In Speaking and Listening, students will participate in daily reflections, focusing on sharing their learning.

a broad range of activities in Mathematics. In Number and Algebra, students will be exploring multiplication and division. They will be exposed to a range of strategies like repeated addition, equal grouping, arrays and partitioning to solve different problems.

In Geometric Reasoning, they will learn about locational and positional language to give and follow directions as well as learn how to read

They will also use their understanding of this language to assist them in reading quarter to and past times on an analogue clock.

This term, Year Two students will participate in a range of activities to use their knowledge of the past to reflect on what has changed and what has stayed the same through generations.

They will be given the opportunity to view the perspective of an elder as well as learn more about the community so that they can make comparisons to their life.

1-5	Multiplication and division	Ask your child to practice multiplication by using repeated addition e.g. 2x3—2+2+2. Ask your child to practice division by using equal groupings e.g. share 10 cookies with your friends. How many will each get?	
6-8	Position and Direction	Ask your child to create directions to familiar places and practice following them. Encourage them to use language like left, right, forward, etc.

1-11	Gender and Identity, Positive Gender Relations	This term Year 2 students will be building on their skills to form and maintain positive relationships through communication. They will also explore the importance of curiosity, having a growth mindset and resilience. These lessons aim to promote understanding, respect, and inclusivity among all students. Students will learn the importance of respecting others' identities and experiences.
