## ECHUCA-MOAMA

## SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- All entries must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary at Echuca no later than 6.00pm on Closing Dates. The age and pedigree of all livestock must be stated on each Entry.
- 2. Exhibitors of machinery must provide material necessary to enable them to comply with the Society's Regulations. All Machinery in motion to be in the charge of the driver.
- All Exhibits must be on the ground by 9.00am on the morning of the Show, excepting where specially provided for, and all Stock must not be removed before
- Any competitor behaving in a manner deemed to be dangerous or disruptive shall be given one warning. If that person continues they shall be asked to leave the arena and the showgrounds immediately.
- 5 The Society will not be responsible for any accidents that may be caused through or by any Exhibits, and it shall be a condition of entry that each Exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such accidents.
- The Society will not under any 6. circumstances hold itself liable for any accidents on the ground or premises.
- The Society will not under any 7. circumstances hold itself liable for any damage to, or any misdelivery of any Exhibits.
- 8. EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: Any complaint, grievance or protest must be lodged within 30 minutes of completion of Class with Secretary with a deposit of \$50.00 and same will be forfeited if considered frivolous by Protests Committee.

Rule Eight. In relation to the disciplinary proceedings of the Society paragraphs (1) to (8) shall apply: -

- Subject to paragraph (2) the committee may suspend or penalise any person, competitor, stand-holder, Organisation or other body which is subject to the Rules of the Society or who fails to comply with the Rules governing any Show or Exhibition conducted by The Society or who disregards or fails to observe any direction or decision of any Official or Judge appointed by the Society.
- (2) The Committee may not, in the case of any conduct or alleged breach of Rules of Failure to observe directions or decision by any of the persons referred to in paragraph (1) (the person affected) which involves allegations of fraud, dishonesty or moral turpitude on the part of that person


- or for which the Committee proposes to deprive that person of any prize or award previously awarded to impose a suspension of disqualification which is to take effect after to endure beyond the Show or Exhibition at which the conduct hearing or failure to comply occurred or in any other circumstances in which the Rule of natural justice requires a person to receive an oral hearing, suspend or penalise a person affected without first giving that person an opportunity to be heard. The Committee must give the person affected at least 14 days notice of the date on which the hearing into his conduct or alleged contravention or other failure is to be conducted, together with full written particulars of the misconduct or contravention or their failure which is alleged.
- (3) If the Committee determines that the person affected is to be suspended or penalised, the Secretary of the Society shall forthwith upon the making of the determination notify the person affected to the Committees determination and of the existence of his right of appeal under paragraph (4) and of the manner in which and time within which that right must be exercised.
- The person affected may appeal the Committee's decision to the Group with which the Society is affiliated, subject always to the rules of the Society, the Rules of the Association (VAS Ltd.). The notice of appeal must be in writing, accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 and lodged with the Secretary of the Society within 14 days of the receipt by the person affected of notice of the Committee's decision. The notice of appeal must contain full, accurate particulars of the grounds on which the person affected claims that the suspension or penalty should be aside or varied. The Secretary of the Society shall as soon
- as reasonably practicable after they are received forward to the Group the notice of appeal together with full and accurate written particulars of the charge or charges sustained against and penalty or suspension imposed on the person affected.
- (6) Where the person affected does not appeal against the Committee's decision in the manner aforesaid the decision of the Committee shall in all respects be final and conclusive and shall not be called into question by the person affected before the Group, VAS Ltd or any court or other body (whether or not a similar nature or a court) whatsoever.
- (7) Where the person affected does not appeal against a suspension or penalty imposed on him by the Committee within the time limits prescribed by paragraph (4), the committee

- may if it considers further disciplinary action is required, refer the matter to the Group. In this event the Secretary of Society, shall as soon as reasonably practicable after the last day on which the person affected could have lodged an appeal under paragraph (4) provide the Group with full charge or charges sustained against and the penalty or suspension imposed on the person affected, and any other relevant information.
- (8) Where in accordance with their rules either the Group or VAS Ltd directs that person shall be subject to a penalty or suspension which is to apply throughout the Group or throughout the State of Victoria, the Society agrees to implement each such direction.
- NO UNAUTHORISED PERSON ALLOWED ON ARENA AT ANY TIME.
- (10)All Exhibitors, unless holding a Members Ticket, must pay at the Gate





## **ECHUCA MOAMA SHOW SITE PLAN**




