Good Standing Policy for Student Off Campus Participation

Purpose:

To promote academic achievement, responsible and positive behaviours, and consistent attendance among students while supporting their participation and representation in external sporting events or study tours, as part of a well-rounded education.

Eligibility Requirements

To be in "Good Standing" and eligible to participate in school sports, students must meet the following criteria:

1. Academic Performance

- Maintain a minimum C average or meet individualized academic progress plans.
- In line with the Progression Policy students on **academic probation** may not participate until grades improve.
- Academic eligibility will be checked **at the end of each reporting period** (quarter or semester) and periodically during the term.

2. Behaviour and Conduct

- Adhere to Endeavour College's **code of conduct** on and off campus.
- Students with suspensions or repeated disciplinary referrals may be declared ineligible for a set period (e.g., 1-2 weeks or longer, depending on severity).
- Any involvement in bullying, fighting, substance use, or other serious offenses may result in **immediate suspension from the team**.
- Adhere to all school rules including uniform and punctuality

3. Attendance

- Maintain **at least 90% school attendance** (including excused and unexcused absences).
- Students **must attend all** trainings prior to match day unless they have a medical certificate or other academic excursion/camp
- Chronic tardiness may also affect eligibility.

4. Coach and Teacher Feedback

- Coaches and teachers may provide input regarding the student's readiness to participate based on work ethic, effort, and attitude.
 - Students are expected to complete all class assignments and maintain respectful relationships with staff.
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Probation and Appeals

- Students who lose good standing may be placed on **probation** for a set period with the opportunity to regain eligibility through demonstrated improvement.
- An **appeals process** may be available through a school eligibility committee composed of administrators, teachers, and coaches.

Communication and Support

- Parents/guardians will be notified if a student is at risk of losing eligibility.
- Academic support and mentoring may be offered to help students meet requirements.
- Consultation with Heads of School, Heads of Village and Heads of Department.
