


#### Defining a Saint





A saint is a person recognized for their extraordinary holiness, virtue, and closeness to God, often serving as an example for others to follow. Sainthood is a formal status, with saints respected as intercessors with God.




### Step 1



Before the Church considers anyone for canonization, they have to no longer be living. Five years after the death, the local bishop opens an official cause for canonization. As long as there is no objection from the Catholic Church, the cause opens and the person is declared a "Servant of God."

#### Step 2

Next the Catholic Church investigates to see if they lived with heroic virtue.

Depending on the person, this step can take many years.

In some cases, this also includes seeing whether the person's death was a martyrdom for the faith.

#### Step 3

Next, the bishop submits it to the Congregation for the Causes of the Saints.


Nine theologians review and vote to approve or deny the Cause.

When cleared, the Cause finally moves to the Pope who finalizes whether to continue or not.

If the Pope approves their heroic virtue, he declares them to be a "Venerable." If the findings also support a true martyrdom, the person is a "Blessed" instead.

#### Step 4

Once a Venerable, the person must have a miracle attributed to their intercession.


All potential miracles go through a similar rigorous process for authenticity.

Science must not be able to explain the miracle.

After the Church approves the miracle, the Pope declares the Venerable to be a Blessed.

#### Step 5

Like in the last step, the Blessed requires another approved miracle to move to the final stage.



This miracle must take place after their beatification occurred.

After he approves the second miracle, the Pope declares them a saint. According to the Catholic Church, the saint is in heaven.











He also catalogued visions of the Virgin Mary and built websites for religious causes.




