<u>Religion</u>

Exploring the New Testament

Students will learn about the different sections of the bible. They will explore New Testament stories about Jesus and discuss the messages found in parables.

Friends of Jesus

English

Little Learners Love Literacy

The Little Learners Love Literacy (LLLL) program will continue in Term 3. We have taught the process of teaching the simple code in Stages 1–4. We are now moving on to Stage 4+ - 6 which focuses on the following skills:



- Introducing children to common double letters such as /ll/, /ss/, /ff/, /zz/, /tt/, /gg/, /dd/
- The morphology (study of words and their parts) focusing on the -s and -es suffix.
- Words with adjacent consonants (CVCC, CCVC, CCVCC)
- Multisyllabic words (hearing, reading and spelling words with syllables)
- Morphology of words (study of words and their parts)
- Digraphs including /ck/, /sh/, /ch/ and trigraph /tch/, /th/, /ng/
- Punctuation marks including possessive apostrophes, exclamation marks and question marks

There will continue to be a strong focus on phonemic awareness through the daily use of Heggerty. The Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Curriculum includes explicit instruction in the following phonological and phonemic awareness skills: rhyming, initial phoneme isolation, blending, isolating final and medial phonemes (sounds), segmenting, adding phonemes, deleting phonemes and substituting phonemes.

Decodable books

LLLL decodable books will continue to be sent home weekly. Readers will be sent home every Monday and are to be returned on Friday. New Heart word posters will be sent home this term. Practising these each day makes a difference!

Mathematics

Number and Algebra

We will:

- examine properties of numbers 0-20
- represent practical situations to model addition and subtraction
- explore sharing and grouping
- recognise models of numbers, related to the use of money

Measurement and Geometry

We will:

explore the length, mass and capacity



What can you do at home?

- Play board games such as Snakes and Ladders with two dice and encourage your child to add the two numbers rolled. Show how to "count on" from the larger number.
- Play card games such as "21 or bust". In this game, two cards are dealt to
 each player and the numbers are added together. Each player may ask for
 more cards from the "kitty" with the aim of being the person with the highest
 score that does not go over 21.
- Ask your child to help you work out how many more items are needed when you are shopping. I have six apples here, how many more will I get to make ten?
- Look at house numbers when going for a walk. Ask your child to guess what the next number will be.
- Have your child help share food for the family. How many slices will I need to cut the pizza into so that everyone has two slices?
- Decorate patty cakes with sultanas or smarties. Ask your child to find out how many you will need altogether if you place the same number of sultanas or smarties on each cake.
- Count the number of ice cubes in a tray. If your child counts by ones, suggest counting by the number in each row of the tray. (This will usually be counting by twos.)

<u>Inquiry</u>

Living Things

In this unit of study, students will explore the world of Living Things. They will discover the important role that animals and plants play in our lives. They will learn about the different needs and features of plants and animals and how they change over time. We will foster this learning with an excursion to the Melbourne Zoo on

Friday 12th September. More details to follow soon!



Digital Technologies

Digital technologies will continue to be integrated daily into other subject areas like English and Mathematics. Children will still have Digital Technologies lessons with their classroom teacher, which will address specific skill acquisition. They will have discussions around being cybersafe and using devices correctly. Children will regularly be involved in reflecting on work that has been uploaded to Seesaw. Children will also begin to independently upload items to Seesaw.

We Thinkers Series

This term we will focus on the "We Thinkers Series." The series helps children build foundational social competencies and essential life skills through stories, lessons, and play activities. It helps children understand themselves and others, develop self-awareness, perspective taking, social problem solving, and supports students' social-emotional learning, relationship building, classroom learning, and academic performance.
