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<u>Mini Mission</u>

The students have been working very hard at creating their stalls in preparation for Mini Mission. This will be held at St James on Friday 29th August from 11am-1pm. All members of the community are most welcome to attend. As a Year Six cohort, they have chosen to raise money for the two charities, The Blackdog foundation and the Parish card marking group who are raising money for refugees fleeing the Ukraine. Thank you for the support you have given to the students in preparation for the day, however, we want to reinforce that it is not a requirement for parents to contribute money. Confirmation

We are all looking forward to our Confirmation on 20th August. In preparation, we have a family information evening, a retreat day at St John's and a commitment mass. All students are expected to attend one of the commitment masses. The students will be required to complete a mini-project all about their chosen saint. This task will be completed at home and at school.

<u>Religion</u>

In this unit students learn about the Holy Spirit in Scripture and through an introduction to the study of Confirmation. They learn of the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit. They begin to explore Confirmation as a sacrament and a celebration. At the conclusion of this unit, students explore ways in which they can use their gifts and talents to serve God and others.

Integrated Inquiry

This term our Integrated Inquiry unit focuses on History and how understanding our past helps us to belong. Our unit is titled 'How do I hear and honour the belonging stories of others?' We will begin by looking at specific moments in Australia's history including Captain Cook's journey and the impact on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. The students have been asked to bring in an artifact from home, such as an item that has been passed down through generations or holds a particular significance to their family story, to share with the class.

<u>English</u>

The students will be continuing with their Literature Circle rotations this term on a Wednesday, beginning in week 4. If you would be interested in assisting with these sessions please email one of us. In conjunction with this, students will also be developing their ability to take notes from oral sources and read and interpret a variety of text types. Throughout the term, students will be writing biographies, information reports and a variety of poetry.

<u>Mathematics</u>

The students will be continuing to focus on developing their skills in fractions, decimals and percentages. They will explore Chance experiments and explain their reasoning using their knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages. In conjunction with participating in the Mini Mission Fete, students will explore money, focusing on calculating discounts on purchases. In the area of measurement, students will learn about location and angles.

It is important that students continue to strengthen their number facts and multiplication tables. Remember - Mathletics is always a fantastic resource to use at home.

There will be a homework club for students who have failed to complete this.
