During Advent, we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus and thank God for the gifts of hope, love, joy, and peace.

This guide has a weekly activity and prayer to help your family in getting ready for Christmas.

Making an Advent wreath can assist your family to learn about the season while building Christ-focused anticipation for Christmas in a simple, peaceful way.

May your advent be full of the joy and peace of Christ this year!





Advent wreaths consist of a circle of evergreen branches, the evergreens signify continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. Four candles are placed into the wreath, representing the four weeks of Advent. Ideally, three candles are purple and one is rose, but white candles with purple and pink ribbon can also be used.

The purple candles symbolise the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. Purple also signifies the 'royalty' of Jesus Christ.

The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday. The third Sunday is known as Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin word meaning 'rejoice ye'. It is a pause in the penitential spirit of Advent. As such, the third candle, representing joy, is often a different colour from the other three.

The light of the candles reminds us that Jesus comes into the darkness of our lives to bring newness, life and hope. We gradually add more light each Sunday until Christ, our Light, comes at Christmas.

The tradition of lighting candles and praying around an Advent Wreath offers families the perfect opportunity to pause and pray together. Through shared prayer and reflection, families encounter Jesus together while preparing their hearts for His coming. The Family Advent guide may be used at meal times or another time that suits your family.

Let us pray for God's blessings upon us and upon the wreath.



Reflection

- 2. How can our family share the story of Jesus' birth with our friends?

Prayer

Jesus, as we wait for your coming, help us not to be afraid and to trust in you. As we light this candle, we remember that you bring the light of hope into our lives. We thank you for the gift of hope.

Make a list of the many ways God shows His love to your family.



Feel the joy

Joy is a feeling of inner gladness, delight or rejoicing. This inner gladness leads to a cheerful heart and a cheerful heart leads to cheerful behaviour. Joy is different to feeling happy. People and material things can bring happiness but joy comes from the Holy Spirit.

Family activity - Spreading joy

As a family plan some ways that you can bring joy to someone else. You might like to make Christmas cards for relatives, bake biscuits for your neighbour, donate food items to Vinnies, or deliver a Christmas present for a sick child to your local children's ward.

Reflection

- 1. Can you think of a time that our family experienced great joy?
- 2. How can we share the joy with others?

Prayer

Jesus, we gather here as a family to dedicate our lives to you, as John the Baptist did. Help us to know, love, and serve you. As we light this candle, we remember that You bring the light of joy into our lives. Help us to bring joy to others. May Your word be always in our minds, on our lips, and in our hearts.

Jesus gives us peace

Peace is the feeling of being safe and secure. Children feel at peace wrapped in mum or dad's arms. Peace is trusting God to take care of our needs in any situation. Forgiveness brings us peace too because it draws us closer in our relationship with God.

Family activity - My peace promise

Reflection

- 1. When do you feel safe, secure and at peace?
- 2. How can our family help others to feel at peace?

Jesus, your mother, Mary, is "blessed among women." We are happy that she said "Yes!" to being your mother. As we light this candle, we remember that You bring the light of love and the gift of peace into our lives. Help us to forgive and to share Your peace with others.

The birth of Desus

Luke 2: 1-20

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment when Quirin'i-us was governor of Syria. And all went to be enrolled, each to his own city.

And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger because there was no place for them in the inn.

And in that region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. And the angel said to them, "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.
