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The St Philip's College Music Scholarship is designed to assist musically able students to attend the College. The scholarship provides 50% of annual College tuition fees and is tenable for two years.

Two scholarships are available:

Junior Music Scholarship - for students who will be entering Year 7 only, and

Senior Music Scholarship – for Year 11 or 12 students (new or current).

The successful candidates for these scholarships will be selected primarily by means of an audition. If, in the opinion of the panel, a satisfactory level of performance is not achieved in any year, then the scholarship will not necessarily be awarded in that year.

Expectations of Scholarship Holders

The successful candidates for both the Junior and Senior Music Scholarships will be expected to:

- be a representative of the College's Performing Arts community in relation to music;
- undertake music tuition classes on a regular basis;
- be enrolled in Year 11 or 12 Music as an academic subject (Senior Scholarship only)
- participate in musical activities within St Philip's College as requested by the Performing Arts staff, for instance:
 - the College's band or strings group
 - participate in the musical, either on stage or as part of the band;
 - any other performance when required.

If the successful candidates at any time during their tenure choose to not fulfil these expectations then the Scholarship will be revoked. Also, should a satisfactory standard of music learning not be maintained, or an action occur which is deemed to be inappropriate for a student of St Philip's College, then the Head of Creative Industries and the Principal may decide to revoke the scholarship.

Audition Requirements

Auditions are held annually at St Philip's College. The candidates:

- are required to present themselves at St Philip's College on the day and at the time allocated to them, unless prior arrangements have been made;
- are required to prepare a program for performance lasting not more than five minutes in the case of the Junior Music Scholarship, or ten minutes in the case of the Senior Music Scholarship;
- are required to show skills of sight reading music;
- can, if they wish, audition on more than one instrument (but not more than two), including voice. The total time of the audition should remain as set out in the dot point above;
- will, if necessary, provide their own accompanist or backing track.
